FR. VU TRAN, PASTOR

od's grace and peace be with you always, and hope you are doing well and adjusting to the many changes that we have been going through for the last few years. I'm glad that you are adaptable and flexible. I always like the biblical image of God as the potter and we are the clay, and God molds us, but we must be supple and flexible enough for God's fingers to work effectively.

Valentine's Day is in the month of February. It's a time of romance, for warm fuzzies, for romantic music and duets, and Hershey chocolate kisses, to celebrate the gift of love. It would be wonderful that during this month, we lift up in our prayers for all our beloved couples in the parish, and by our gestures to show our love and support for them. To give thanks to God for the Sacrament of Marriage, a sign of God's love and presence with us when we see our beloved couples, embracing the Sacrament here on earth, to be helpmates for one another, as they make their journey to heaven.

In the book of Genesis, marriage is the first sacrament from God to Adam and Eve because God is the source of the gift of marriage. A parallel in the Gospel of John, the first recorded miracle or sign is the Wedding Feast of Cana where Jesus turned the water into wine. The young newly married couple invited Jesus, Mary, and the Saints into their lives. Not only was the water changed into wine, but their lives as well.

I remember going to grade school, and on St Valentine's Day, it was a special occasion because we would bring Valentine's Day cards and give them to each other, along with chocolate kisses, and these little candy hearts with loving words on them such as Be Mine or I Heart You, etc. Looking back it was a fun and an enjoyable experience, because who among us doesn't want to feel loved and valued. But I often wondered, who is this St Valentine and how is it that the day of love is named after him. What did he do to deserve this honor and memory? It turns out one of the legends of St Valentine, he was a priest in the early church, who lived during a time when the Roman Emperor forbade marriages because he needed young men to serve in the Roman Army. So Fr. Valentine helped couples to enter into Marriage, but he celebrated marriages privately and secretly, underground if you will. But when the Emperor discovered what he had done, Fr. Valentine received the crown of martyrdom. This legend reveals that the Sacrament of Marriage, and Family Life was important for St Valentine. He was willing to offer his life for this belief.

We pray and give thanks to God for our beloved couples. Thank you for being signs of God's loving presence in the world. Together for Christ!

LENTEN RESOLUTIONS

As we are walking through February, the month of Love, what are you planning to do this Lenten season to further your loving relationship with God? Remember, *a failure to plan is a plan to fail (Benjamin Franklin)*. Take some time now to develop your plan and encourage others in your family to do the same.

Here are some thoughts for ADULTS:

- If you get coffee out regularly, get a smaller size or only go every other day or once a week, and give the money you would have spent to Rice Bowl. When you find yourself wanting to head to the coffee shop, say a quick prayer for your special Lenten intention.
- Do you have lunch or dinner out often? Once a week during Lent, try planning a simple meal of rice and beans and give the savings to Rice Bowl.
- Read from one of the Gospels or the Acts of the Apostles every day for 15 minutes. Ask yourself what did you read that you can apply in your life? Are you like an apostle, a disciple, or a bystander in what you read today?
- Try a new book:



- Come to the Stations of the Cross on Friday Nights and connect with someone you've never met before.
- Come spend time with Jesus in Adoration. The chapel is open M-F 8:30-4:30 and on weekends while there are events taking place in the building.

Here are some thoughts for CHILDREN:

- Instead of buying lunch at school, once or twice a week make your own of things you find left over in the fridge or pantry (ask parent to make sure this is okay). Put the money you would have spent at school in the family Rice Bowl.
- Do a chore around the house without being asked.
- Pick a toy or game that your sibling likes to play and play with her/him for an hour.
- Try to include someone at school who isn't normally part of your friend group. Jesus befriended many people considered outcasts. Can you be like him?
- Are you artistic? Draw a picture or make a photo collage of something that makes you think about Jesus or your relationship with God, or a miracles you see in the world today.
- Try to pray every night before you go to bed for 5 minutes. Think about your day, what went well and not so well and ask God to help you do better the next day.

GOOD STEWARDSHIP OF TREASURE PRACTICES:

Planned

A decision requiring thought & time so as not to give what is merely left at the end of a week.

Proportionate

Our giving is proportionate to what God has given to us. We give in proportion to the gifts we have received.

•Sacrificial

We give back from our substance, rather than our abundance.

•Grateful

Acknowledging that God is the source of all our gifts, we freely, without reservation or condition, give back to Him by sharing these gifts. "Bring the full tithe into the storehouse, so that there may be food in my house, and thus put me to the test, says the Lord of hosts; see if I will not open the windows of heaven for you and pour down for you an overflowing blessing." Malachi 3:10
