o you know why Holy Week is so important for us? Because it is the final week of Jesus' life. On Palm Sunday, Jesus entered Jerusalem for the final time. He celebrated the Last Supper with his disciples on Holy Thursday, and washed their feet to model an example of loving service. He was arrested at the Garden of Gethsemane that night, and the next day, Good Friday, gave his life on the cross at 3:00pm. Holy Saturday is the celebration of the resurrection of Christ.

The three days: Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday are called Sacred Triduum or Paschal Triduum. These three days help us to relive the final three days of Jesus' life, His passion, death, and resurrection (Paschal Mystery), and to give thanks for Jesus, the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world.

This mystery of faith finds its roots in the Exodus event, the Sacrificial Lamb at the first Passover in Egypt. In order for the Angel of Death to pass over their homes and spare their life, they marked their doorposts and lintel with the blood of the Sacrificial Lamb, and consumed its flesh.

The annual Jewish Passover celebration helped the Israelites to remember God's saving power and might, and God's fidelity to the covenant. It is God who brought them to the Promised Land. The Easter Triduum helps us to celebrate the fulfillment of the Old Covenant in the New Covenant that Jesus has fulfilled, through his sacrifice, and his resurrection from the dead.

HOLY THURSDAY

Holy Thursday is known as the Mass of the Lord's Supper. This is where the Church relives the institution of the Eucharist and the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass at the Last Supper, as well as the institution of the priesthood, which took place the evening before Jesus was crucified.

At the beginning of Mass, the Oil of the Sick, the Oil of Catechumens, and the Holy Chrism, which were blessed by the Archbishop during the Chrism Mass are presented to and received by the local parish community. After the homily there is the "washing of the feet" ceremony, where the priest washes the feet of others to signify his role as servant—just as Jesus did with his disciples. The Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday concludes with a procession of the Blessed Sacrament to the "altar of repose," and a time to pray and keep watch with Jesus. "Can you not keep watch with me for just one hour?"

GOOD FRIDAY

Besides Ash Wednesday, Good Friday is a time for fasting and practicing abstinence. Good Friday is the day that Jesus died on the cross at 3:00pm. The sanctuary looks very different, plain and bare, the altar is stripped, the tabernacle is empty. The vigil candle is extinguished. The baptismal font is empty. This starkness is to remind us that it is a time of mourning and prayer because Jesus has died, he is gone. The ceremony on Good Friday is not a Mass—it is a communion service with the consecrated hosts from Holy Thursday. Good Friday is the only day of the year there is no Mass.

The service begins with silence, the priest starts by prostrating himself in front of the altar. After the Passion Reading from the Gospel of St John, and the solemn intercessions, there is the Veneration of the Cross, in which we are able to come forward to kiss and make a profound bow towards the cross of Christ. "Because by your holy cross, Thou has redeemed the world."

HOLY SATURDAY

This special day is a time to celebrate Christ's resurrection, beginning with the blessing of the fire outside, and procession into the sanctuary with the Easter Candle. The church sanctuary is kept dark, as we process in with our individual candles and listen to the number of readings to help us recall God who lovingly created the world, and God who continues to save the world because of love. "For God so love the world that He gave his only Son." Jesus is the light that comes into the world, and dispels the darkness. We try to convey that through the use of light settings in the sanctuary. The Easter Vigil is also special because it is a time to welcome into the church, the Elect and Candidates who are seeking the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation.

There you have it, the final week of Jesus' life in which we are able to relive this great Paschal Mystery, of Jesus' life, death and resurrection. I invite you to spend time in the Holy Week and come to all the services to pray together as a community of faith, to drink deeply the mystery of faith, to give witness to the Kenosis, the self-emptying of Christ for love of the world.

CCC1169: Easter is not simply one feast among others, but the "Feast of feasts," the "Solemnity of solemnities," just as the Eucharist is the "Sacrament of sacraments" (the Great Sacrament).

Don't miss out! Come join us for Holy Week, and the Easter Triduum, so that together we can joyfully proclaim:
