

FR. VU TRAN, PASTOR

Catholic school teacher wanted to teach her class about Easter, and the importance of the Easter Season. In her class, there were 19 students. Some of them were smart and brilliant, many were average, but one student in particular stood out. His name was Jeremy. He was special. He was born abnormally, with a heart condition. He also had a learning disability. At the age of 12, he was in the 2nd grade. His life expectancy was not long.

So the teacher met with his parents and said that Jeremy doesn't belong here, he belongs in a special school. But his parents objected saying, "We want to give him as normal a life as possible. There is no resource like that nearby. We also know that he really likes it here at this school." So the teacher prayed to God for more patience and understanding. One day, Jeremy, out of the blue said to the teacher, "I love you, Miss Miller." It was loud enough that the entire class heard it and snickered, and her face turned bright red. She said, "Wh-Why, that's very nice of you, Jeremy. Now, please take your seat."

During the Easter Season, Miss Miller shared with her students about the importance of the season, and the story about Jesus. Easter is about **new life**. She gave them a homework assignment. Every student was given a plastic Egg, and she wanted them to bring the egg back the next day with something inside that shows **new life**.

The next day, the students eagerly returned and placed their plastic eggs in a large wicker basket on her desk. So Miss Miller opened their eggs to see what ideas the students came up with.

Inside the first plastic egg, she found a small flower. And she said, "Yes, a flower is a sign of new life. When we see flowers, we know that spring is here." A little girl in the front row waved her arms and said, "That's my egg, Miss Miller."

Miss Miller opened the next egg, and inside she found a plastic butterfly. She said, "Yes, we all know that a caterpillar changes and grows into a beautiful butterfly. That is also a sign of new life." A little boy across the room proudly waved his hand and said: "That's my egg, Miss Miller.

Inside the third egg, she found a rock with some moss on it, and its also a sign of new life. Billy from the back of the class raised his hand, and said, "That's my egg, Miss Miller. My Daddy helped me."

And then she opened the fourth egg, and to her surprise, there was nothing inside the plastic egg. She suspected that this egg belonged to Jeremy. She regretted not calling Jeremy's parents and informing them about the homework assignment, to save him from embarrassment. So she quickly set the egg aside and reached into the basket for another egg. As she did so, Jeremy said, "Miss Miller, aren't you going to talk about my egg?"

She said, "Yes Jeremy, but your egg is empty! There's nothing inside," and he said, "Yes, because when the people went to the tomb of Jesus, they found the tomb empty." Miss Miller asked him," Do you know why it was empty?" Jeremy said, "Yes, Miss Miller. Jesus was killed, and he was buried in the tomb. Then his Father raised him up." She was amazed by Jeremy's profound understanding of Easter.

About a year later, unfortunately, Jeremy died. But next to his casket, there was a wicker basket filled with 19 plastic eggs, all of them empty. *-Unknown Author*


