FR. VU TRAN, PASTOR

August 4 - St John Vianney Feast Day

To alleviate from overworking, St John Vianney was given an assistant priest named Fr. Raymond. Fr. Raymond was the opposite of John Vianney. He was handsome, well dressed, and wore the finest of garments. St. John Vianney wore the finest of vestments at the altar, but he wore the same battered clothing. Fr Raymond was also super organized, unlike John Vianney. John Vianney would wake up and went about with his pastoral duties, whatever they were. He heard confessions, he said the Mass, he visited the sick, and he went on begging tours. He was always busy, but he never did things in a particular order. On the other hand, Fr. Raymond, was a person of order. He had a system whereby men would come to confessions at a certain time, and women at another time. He was issuing bulletins, and lists of rules. He would always sign his name as Pastor. Although it bothered the parishioners, it didn't bother John Vianney. He also told John Vianney to give up his bedroom on the second floor: "Why should an old man like you have to go up and down those hard stone stairs. You will be just as comfortable in the little bedroom on the first floor. Am I not right?" John Vianney replied: "Whatever you say, Fr. Raymond." Fr. Raymond said: "Ok, great, I will have your bed moved downstairs at once. John Vianney replied: "Oh, don't worry. I can sleep on the floor." He did so for many months. When the people of the town discovered this, they and together with the Mayor took Fr. Raymond aside and chastised him. And ultimately, the bedroom was given back to St. John Vianney. After 8 years, Fr. Raymond was given a different assignment. At first, John Vianney was relieved. But after a time, he found himself missing Fr. Raymond. The housekeeper said: "You miss Fr. Raymond, I don't see how you could. I was overjoyed to see him go." But John Vianney replied: "Fr. Raymond was good for me." But the housekeeper said: "He didn't do anything but criticize you and made your life completely miserable." John Vianney replied: "Exactly. God sent Fr. Raymond as a penance. You know the ancient truth. Sometimes God tests those He loves with many trials. As long as Fr. Raymond was here, I knew that God loved me. Now, I'm not so sure." For the housekeeper, there was no doubt that God did love this simple and humble priest, St. John Vianney.






FACILITIES WORKSHOP

We have a couple of major projects happening this summer:

- The parking lot paving, repair, curb cutting, sealing and painting project is now complete. This was a much needed major project and the cost was around \$100,000. The amount of replacement asphalt done should last us for upwards of 20-25 years before any major repair work is needed. We should not need sealing and striping for about 10 years. We now have pathways cut through the curbs with crosswalks into both the north and south gravel lots for safer access for pedestrians. Extra striping in the area of the drive around the main walking entrance has been added for extra caution reminders to drivers. Two new Handicap Stalls were identified by the back doors. Several improvements were made to facilitate better draining and water management. Almost all the standard parking spaces are now 9' wide as opposed to the previous spacing that was 6.5 7' wide on average.

 Remember Extra proceeds from ACA giving are dedicated to this project!
- Father Vu's "Doors of Heaven" has Archdiocesan approval to proceed and the materials have been ordered. The project is scheduled to start around the first of September and will take at least of couple of weeks.
- The Mother Mary statue project is nearing completion. The little courtyard will be made by **Bill Lamb**, and the Judy Smith memorial bench should be in place by the middle of August. A special thanks to **Leoni Radford** for all her work in cleaning up and reorganizing the area for our Mother Mary!
- The Rectory has a new chimney now so we don't have to worry about it falling on Fr. Vu anymore.
- The Rectory now has a new cedar fence and the entire project was done by volunteers who worked diligently to take down the old and rebuild the new in record time. It is almost 300' of fence! Thanks to the two teams made up by: Joe & Carter Loutsis, Kaia, Liam and Avi Lefohn, Fred Cuanzon, Manny Baluyot, Jim Dowling, Paul and Deb Lichon, Steve Zeller, Tony Zimmerman, Greg Nolan, Greg Seiler, Stan Madayag, Mike & Amanda McAuliff, Brad Lund and our beloved Fr Vu. And a great big THANK YOU to Kathy Estey for financing the entire project. You guys are awesome!
- The grounds are looking great thanks in great part to all the volunteers we have! A great big thank you to our fabulous Facilities Committee and their dedication, and Tony's Adopt-a-Bed team!
- The Master Gardeners are doing so much with that little plot of grass in the north gravel parking area. So far, they have donated almost 20# of produce to a local Food Bank! Great to partner with them as they do so many good things. Go by and check it out.

ADOPT - A - GARDEN BED

Most of the beds are still looking good in spite of the hot weather. Thank you!

If you happen to have any roses in your bed please check out the leaves for Black Spot. It is a fungus that starts out as a small black spot on the leaves. The spots rapidly enlarge, turn the leaves yellow and spread to other leaves and adjoining roses. If you see them, please pick the leaves off and dispose of them in the garbage, not recycle. We are trying to keep the problem under control with frequent spray, but it is a challenge. We are also on a regular schedule putting fertilizer around the roses. So hopefully all you will have to do with your roses is try to keep taking off the leaves that are infected, and cut off the spent blossoms. Best way to remove the old blossoms is to cut them off just above an outside five leaf



SOLEMNITY OF THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY **August 15**

In the United States and other countries, the bishops have received permission from the Vatican to abrogate (temporarily waive) the requirement for Catholics to attend Mass on certain Holy Days of Obligation when those Holy Days fall on either Saturday or Monday. This

can create confusion about whether certain feasts are, in fact, Holy Days of Obligation. The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary (August 15) is one such Holy Day. It is a Holy Day of Obligation, however, when it falls on a Saturday or a Monday, the obligation to attend Mass is abrogated. This year, the Feast of the Assumption falls on Monday. CAMPAIGN UPDATE

We are continually grateful for the generosity of people across the Archdiocese of Seattle who supported the Called to Serve As Christ Campaign. Over 23,000 families from every parish in the diocese contributed more than \$65,500,000 in gifts and pledges. To date we have already received \$53,600,000 in cash and have dispersed it all.



Afghan Refugee Family on Finn Hill July Update - Thank you for your continued support and prayers for our Afghan Refugee Families here on Finn Hill. We are all so grateful!

- Temporary Storage Space Needed The apartments the families are planning to move into will not be ready until mid-October due to delays in construction. They are in need of secure storage space for their furniture until August 15 – October 15. Please contact Susan, sweaver@sjvkirkland.org, if you know of space available in the local area.
- Once a move in date is scheduled, a list of furniture or household good donations needed will be shared, as well as details on help needed for the move.
- Their younger sister has an asylum appointment scheduled and a second interview has been requested for the second sister. Prayers are needed for positive decision on their cases.
- Their family in Afghanistan are in a safe place, but are in need of funding for the rent and utilities as staying safe prohibits them from working. Getting them out remains a crucial priority.



There will be scheduled breaks and opportunities to practice the skills built in the workshop, including practice on how to talk about this subject with others.
