

CHILDREN AND FAMILY LIFE

Catholic Kids' Catechism Club (CKCC): We offer sessions for 3yrs - kindergarteners during the 9:00am Mass. Parents drop their children off in Room #6 where we learn about the Mass. At about 9:30 the children move into the preschool classroom with Ms. Lindy our catechist, where they hear the Sunday Gospel and have an opportunity to do related crafts, play, and enjoy a snack.

We welcome our 1st - 5th graders to our mad-capped fun on Sundays from 9:55-10:55am OR on Mondays from 7:00-8:00pm in Room #6. Registration forms are available at the welcome table and on our parish website.

Baptism for children over the age of 7: If your child has not received the Sacrament of Baptism and they are over the age of 7 years, we have a special opportunity for them to grow in their faith and receive this gift in the form of an adapted Adult Baptism initiation. We will have special classes to help your child learn more about all that comes with this special gift!

Family Self-Help Resources: We have resources for you and your family to use in times of grief and loss, as well as Safe Touching classes for children and Sexual Abuse Prevention classes for parents and adult volunteers.

<u>Children's Liturgy of the Word:</u> Children are invited to join us for dismissal during the Sunday 11:00am Mass for Liturgy of the Word. The children hear the gospel reading and have an opportunity to break it open with discussion, activities and other stories that relate to the Gospel. No registration required and parents are welcome to accompany their children if they'd like.

Parish Nursery: The nursery is free and available for children 18 months through 4 years old and staffed at both the Sunday 9:00am and 11:00am Masses. The nursery is located right down the stairs, parents are welcome to stay with their children if it makes them more comfortable. Audio from Mass can be heard in the nursery.

Mom's Morning Out: Wednesday Mornings from 9:30am - 12 noon, primary caregivers of children ages 1-5 can drop their children off in the parish nursery for childcare while the caregiver gets a couple of hours of free time to run errands, relax, clean house, whatever, without a little one under foot. There is a fee of \$15.00 per child per day, a registration form, and a waiting list for this ministry. Parents with more than two children pay a maximum of \$30.00 per day.



AFGHAN REFUGEE FAMILY ON FINN HILL NOVEMBER UPDATE

Thank you for your continued support and prayers for our Afghan Refugee Families whose journey took them through Finn Hill. We are all so grateful!

- ° Our families have settled into their new apartments. Thank you to all who helped with this effort.
- ^o The older children are settled in preschool and elementary school and happy to be living close to cousins & other children their age. They loved OO Denny and any chance to go to the water and have discovered the Washington State Ferries. They look forward to a trip to the Zoo when the air clears and to exploring other parks and attractions in the area as they are able. Thanks to the generous donations of new and gently used clothing for back to school, they have an abundance of options each day and have started a bin of "too big" clothes they can grow into.
- The babies are closing in on their first birthday in the middle of November and are thriving! They are all crawling (quickly!), pulling to stand, taking steps with furniture, babbling to one another, playing with toys and swiping toys from each other as well! They are three distinct little people and their personalities are really starting to show. They are also adorably dressed thanks to kind donors.
- ° One sister was granted asylum in August and work is underway to get her husband and toddler safely out of Afghanistan. While the legal pathway is open, it continues to be an arduous, complicated and likely protracted process. Continued prayers for safety and reunification appreciated.
- $^\circ$ Through the hard work of their original Host families, asylum cases have been filed for the two other sisters along with two young adult cousins who came with them. They are still waiting for news on their asylum decisions, but we've learned it is significant that all members of this family system have been able to get the documents filed as this has not happened for many others. Prayers for patience, and for gratitude to the legal community working so diligently for this family and others.
- ° The extended family is currently safe in Afghanistan but family here continues to learn of losses due to natural causes as well as trauma experienced by close friends. Two brothers are expected to attempt travel to Europe soon to secure their safety.
- The eldest sister as well as two cousins who've been in the Seattle are for 3-5 years have been remarkable models of generosity and support over the last year despite the demands of their own work and family. It has been powerful to observe and learn about the Muslim faith and Afghan traditions which bind this far flung family.
- ^o The Sisters have two big hurdles ahead: continuing to build their English skills and obtaining employment which will allow them to maintain their housing.

SVDP CHRISTMAS FOOD BOX COLLECTION




The SJV St. Vincent de Paul society will be assembling and distributing food baskets again this year for families in great need. Last year we helped 72 families, distrib-


