ear Beloved in Christ, with the last heavy snowfall, I was driving back to Kirkland, with only a few blocks remaining to reach 84th Street from Simonds Road, but my front wheels started to spin. So, along with a few other cars who couldn't make it up the steep hill, we turned around, and tried Juanita Drive instead. The same thing happened, with just a few blocks to reach the top of the hill, my wheels started to spin. So, I parked the car at the bottom of the hill and decided to walk home. Do you know that a 5-minute drive is equivalent to a 50-minute walk?

I now see how steep Finn Hill is and got temporary snow chains for the future, just in case. But in this little experience, I also saw people getting out of their cars and helping each other. It is potentially risky, but some folks were helping to push cars that were stuck to provide some momentum. People were very patient and understanding, refraining from constantly honking their horns. Seeing all of this gave warmth to my heart, in a way, as I walked home in the icy cold weather. Also, I was able to get a lot of steps in to keep up with my Fitbit competitors.

Christmas is always a cold and dark season in the Pacific Northwest, and it can certainly affect our mood and behavior. But there are small pockets of inspiration if you look for them - a light here and there, to warm our hearts. Many homes are decorated, and brighten us up, giving joy to this season.

It often doesn't take much to give light and warmth, for even a little bit goes a long way. St. Nicholas who heard that a family was in need, decided to help them, by putting coins in their socks that were hung by the fireplace to dry. The story warms my heart every time I hear it.

What also gives warmth to my heart is the Christmas story. In Bethlehem, a child is born to a Virgin. He was born not in a palace that is worthy of him, but in a cave, laid in a manger - a small container that usually holds food for animals. He was visited by shepherds and kings, for he is the Good Shepherd, and he is the great King that is to come, and of his kingdom there will be no end. Upon his arrival into the world, the heavenly host - the choirs of angels filled the heavens, singing the Gloria, praising God.

CHILDREN AND FAMILY LIFE

Family Self-Help Resources: We have resources for you and your family to use in times of grief and loss, as well as Safe Touching classes for children and Sexual Abuse Prevention classes for parents and adult volunteers.

Baptism for children over the age of 7: If your child has not received the Sacrament of Baptism and they are over the age of 7 years, we have a special opportunity for them to grow in their faith and receive this gift in the form of an adapted Adult Baptism initiation. We will have special classes to help your child learn more about all that comes with this special gift!

<u>Catholic Kids' Catechism Club (CKCC):</u> All children are welcome to the fun and learning of Catholic Kids' Catechism Club. Registration forms are available on our parish website or at the welcome table. CKCC resumes January 8 and 9.

Our 3 year old's through kindergarten kids meet downstairs in Room 6 during the 9:00am Mass. Their session begins with learning about the Mass, then they move to Room 2, where they are picked up at the end of Mass. Kids will hear the Gospel for the day, adapted for their little ears, and do activities based on the Gospel.

Our older kids in 1st - 5th grades, attend our sessions on Sundays between 10:00-11:00am or Mondays between 700-8:00pm. We open our sessions with the proclamation of the Gospel and then do an opening challenge related to it. Kids then break off with their clubhouses to complete their challenges! They accumulate points throughout the year and the group that gets the highest number of points wins a party at Pump-It-Up at the end of the year! So much fun in one space, all learning about ourselves and our faith! Sign up today!





First Reconciliation and First Eucharist Preparation:
Kids who are Baptized Catholic and are at or about the age of 7 are welcome to join us for our preparation sessions, which begin at the end of February. Parents and children attend the sessions together.

Parish Nursery: Christmas weekend the nursery will be available for children accompanied by their parents. Our nursery staff will have a well deserved day off. Normally the nursery is free and available for children 18 months through 4 years old and staffed at both the Sunday 9:00am and 11:00am Masses. The nursery is located right down the stairs, parents are welcome to stay with their children if it makes them more comfortable. Audio from Mass can be heard in the nursery.

Children's Liturgy of the Word: Children are invited to join us for dismissal during the regular Sunday 11:00am Mass for Liturgy of the Word. The children hear the gospel reading and have an opportunity to break it open with discussion, activities and other stories that relate to the Gospel. No registration required and parents are welcome to accompany their children if they'd like.

Mom's Morning Out: Wednesday Mornings from 9:30am - 12 noon, primary caregivers of children ages 1-5 can drop their children off in the parish nursery for childcare while the caregiver gets a couple of hours of free time to run errands, relax, clean house, whatever, without a little one under foot. There is a fee of \$15.00 per child per day, a registration form, and a waiting list for this ministry. Parents with more than two children pay a maximum of \$30.00 per day.

2023-2024 School Year

Registration begins January 10, 2023!

At St. John Vianney Catholic Church, our Children's Faith Formation Program has always focused on nurturing our children through stimulating, faith filled, and fun programs. These programs; Catholic Kids' Catechism Club, Children's Liturgy of the Word, Sacramental Preparation, Mom's Morning Out, and Vacation Bible School, celebrate each child as a wonderful gift from God, while fostering growth in the development of education, faith and community.

SJV Catholic Preschool serves as an extension to our Faith Formation Program, adopting the same focus and philosophies, while providing a more structured/play-based program for 3 to 5 year olds. We accept children of all faith backgrounds.

Our 3's class

(3 years old on or before 12/31/23)

A wonderful 1st preschool experience. Our 3's class focuses on social interaction, emotional, physical and spiritual growth in a warm and welcoming learning environment.

Our 3+ class

(4 years old on or before 12/31/23)

We are developing a sense of community where we learn to play, share and communicate with one another. Learning to follow directions, art, circle and story time keep us busy. This class includes a 20 min. lunch period.

Storybook Adventure

(4 years old on or before 12/31/23)

This amazing addition to our current program will take your child on a journey reading and exploring a variety of Children's stories and picture books. We will read, write, illustrate and act out special and new favorites. *Priority will be given to our registered 4's* & 3+ students.

Our 4's class

(4 years old on or before 8/31/23)

This class will give your child the option to move up to our Pre-K class or graduate to Kindergarten in 2023. We offer a play/theme-based curriculum which includes STEM, pre-reading, math and writing activities. We are adding on to the 3+ curriculum with a more academic emphasis. This class incudes a 20 min. lunch period.



Our Pre-K class

(5 years old on or before 12/31/23)

This class is designed for the older child. With an additional 9 hours per month, we are able to add special focus to the base program and have time for more detailed exploration. STEM: Science, Technology, Engineering and Math are part of our daily curriculum. This class also includes a 20 min. lunch period.




YOUTH GROUP
