FATHER VU TRAN, PASTOR

od's grace and peace be with you, Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

Jesus said: "If anyone wishes to come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me."

Being a disciple of Christ, there is one certainty which is the cross. To the Apostles, he revealed what he will have to undergo for our salvation: "The Son of man must suffer greatly, and be rejected and be killed. But on the third day he will rise again."

Have you ever wondered if the Holy Cross has become so common and familiar in our society? Perhaps, you may have become desensitized to the cross. That the cross doesn't have the same impact that it once did from our youth and childhood.

Story: I remember watching the Passion of the Christ when it was in the movie theater (I know it shows my age). Just like with any movie, I would order a large bag of popcorn, with butter and a large drink. But as soon as the movie began, quickly lost my appetite, and barely touched the rest of the popcorn.

Lent is a reboot for the soul. Like pushing restart for the computer, it operates more efficiently. Lent is an opportune time to look at the cross of Jesus again. Not just a glance, but to really, really look at it. When was the last time that you looked closely at the cross? To examine closely from top to bottom, from left to right. It's like looking at it for the very first time.

When you look at the cross, what are some of the thoughts that cross your mind? What are you thinking? Is it: I've seen it before, I'm already familiar with the story of Christ. Has that ever happened to you?

How can the Holy Spirit help you to see the cross, like seeing it for the first time. Do you remember the first time that you heard the story of Christ and saw him on the cross. Here is someone who is hanging there, suspended in the air. He was tortured, beaten and bruised, wearing a crown of thorns, nails in his hands and feet and pierced on his side. He suffered so much, yet he was silent and offered everything up.

Is the cross of Christ just another piece of decoration? Is it just an ornament on the wall? Does it scare you at times? Or is the Cross of Christ the central tenet of your faith? Do you find meaning and value from the cross? Do you feel appreciative and grateful to God when you look at the cross?

St. Paul once said: I resolve to know nothing except for Christ who was crucified.

CHILDREN AND FAMILY LIFE

<u>Family Self-Help Resources:</u> We have resources for you and your family to use in times of grief and loss, as well as Safe Touching classes for children and Sexual Abuse Prevention classes for parents and adult volunteers.

Baptism for children over the age of 7: If your child has not received the Sacrament of Baptism and they are over the age of 7 years, we have a special opportunity for them to grow in their faith and receive this gift in the form of an adapted Adult Baptism initiation. We will have special classes to help your child learn more about all that comes with this special gift!



First Reconciliation and First Eucharist
Preparation: Kids who are Baptized Catholic
and are at or about the age of 7 are welcome
to join us for our preparation sessions. We
have had our first session already. If you
missed our first session and still want to par-

ticipate, contact Laura Stanger. Our second session is scheduled for March 10 and 11. Parents and children attend the sessions together.

Parish Nursery: Our nursery is available for children 18 months through 4 years old and staffed at both the Sunday 9:00am and 11:00am Masses. The nursery is located right down the stairs, parents are welcome to stay with their children if it makes them more comfortable. Audio from Mass can be heard in the nursery.

<u>Children's Liturgy of the Word:</u> Children are invited to join us for dismissal during the regular Sunday 11:00am Mass for Liturgy of the Word. The children hear the gospel reading and have an opportunity to break it open with discussion, activities, and other stories that relate to the Gospel. No registration required and parents are welcome to accompany their children if they'd like.

Mom's Morning Out: Wednesday Mornings from 9:30am - 12:00pm, primary caregivers of children ages 1-5 can drop their children off in the parish nursery for childcare while the caregiver gets a couple of hours of free time to run errands, relax, clean house, whatever, without a little one under foot. There is a fee of \$15.00 per child per day, a registration form, and a waiting list for this ministry. Parents with more than two children pay a maximum of \$30.00 per day.

<u>Catholic Kids' Catechism Club (CKCC):</u> All children are welcome to the fun and learning of Catholic Kids' Catechism Club. Registration forms are available on our parish website or at the welcome table.

Our 3 year old's through kindergarten kids meet downstairs in Room 6 during the 9:00am Mass. Their session begins with learning about the Mass, then they move to Room 2, where they are picked up at the end of Mass. Kids will hear the Gospel for the day, adapted for their little ears, and do activities based on the Gospel.

Our older kids in 1st - 5th grades attend our sessions on Sundays between 10:00-11:00am or Mondays between 7:00-8:00pm. We open our sessions with the proclamation of the Gospel and then do an opening challenge related to it. Kids then break off with their clubhouses to complete their challenges! They accumulate points throughout the year and the group that gets the highest number of points wins a party at Pump-It-Up at the end of the year! So much fun in one space, all while learning about ourselves and our faith! Sign up today!

CKCC Microloan Challenge to support Operation Rice Bowl!

Our CKCC clubhouse members have been challenged to start a microloan business to raise funds for Operation Rice Bowl this Lent. They have done this for many years and it has always been a highlight for them. Your generosity and support of them in their learning about microloans and Catholic Relief Services is such a blessing. They can get a bit zealous in their sales pitch, but know it comes from a place of excitement. Each week after the Masses and possibly at Soup Supper at least one of our clubhouse groups will sell something that they created as part of their business.

AUCTION BRAINSTORMING SESSION




YOUTH GROUP
