

The Partners in the Gospel consultative process for parish family configurations has officially begun.

PartnersEdge, consultants who have worked with several other dioceses, delivered "Draft Zero" of potential parish family configurations based on their data analysis. Specifically, PartnersEdge reviewed parish annual report data as well as priest numbers, parish locations and map data to develop this draft.

"Draft Zero" was then reviewed by the Partners Oversight Committee and the Presbyteral Council to provide input that reflects "on the ground" realities in addition to the data. This process was grounded in prayer and much discernment as the groups examined the potential configurations, reviewed historical relationships, identified multicultural communities, discussed travel and commuting challenges and much more. This additional input was collected to refine the potential parish family configurations with the understanding that the input was not for the final draft, but instead to develop "Draft One" for the next phase of consultation with all the priests in the archdiocese.

Priests will have two different opportunities to review and provide feedback before the next draft is developed for feedback and input by parish and school staff and all Catholics later this fall.

The children hear the gospel reading and have an opportunity to break it open with discussion, activities, and other stories that relate to the Gospel. No registration required and parents are welcome to accompany their children if they'd like.

Mom's Morning Out: Wednesday Mornings from 9:30am - 12:00pm, primary caregivers of children ages 1-5 can drop their children off in the parish nursery for childcare while the caregiver gets a couple of hours of free time to run errands, relax, clean house, whatever, without a little one under foot. There is a fee of \$15.00 per child per day, and a registration formy. Parents with more than two children pay a maximum of \$30.00 per day. There is currently a waiting list for this ministry. <u>Catholic Kids' Catechism Club (CKCC):</u> We begin our faith formation program in October.

Our 3 year old's through kindergarten kids meet downstairs in Room 6 during the 9:00am Mass. Their session begins with learning about the Mass, then they move to Room 2, where they are picked up at the end of Mass. Kids will hear the Gospel for the day, adapted for their little ears, and do activities based on the Gospel.

Our older kids in 1st - 5th grades attend sessions on Sundays between 10:00-11:00am or Mondays between 7:00-8:00pm. We open our sessions with the proclamation of the Gospel and then do an opening challenge related to it. Kids then break off with their clubhouses to complete their chal-

lenges! They accumulate points throughout the year and the group that gets the highest number of points wins a party at Pump-It-Up at the end of the year! Our 3rd graders were the 2022 -23 High Points winners! It really was a great year!

Afghan Refugee Family on Finn Hill June Update

The sisters' legal situation continues to be incredibly frustrating despite Congressional mandating of fast processes for Afghans, who mostly remain in legal limbo. Earlier this year we tried reaching out to Senator Cantwell's office to support our inquiries regarding Shamila's asylum and despite follow up we have not heard back. We are similarly waiting for Nabila's reunification with her husband and young daughter despite having asylum approved. If anyone has contacts at Senator Cantwell or Senator Murray's office, or Representative Larson's office, please reach out to Susan, sweaver@sjvkirkland.org. The system does not seem to move without significant pressure.

On the positive side, Representative Andy Barr's office has sent inquiries on the sisters' behalf even though they were only in Kentucky, a short time. He has been an advocate for Afghans.

A current priority continues to be addressing the dental and medical needs of both women and their children, including helping Nabila and Shamila to learn to navigate the system and appointments.

The older children are enjoying school are making good progress with their English. They are asking about their "Kirkland School" (here on Finn Hill) and seem to be wanting to remember experiences from last year and we are working to support them. It's wonderful for them to be seeking some closure around what was a fairly chaotic spring last year.

The 18-mos well baby checks went well for the triplets – they are thriving, walking everywhere, & enjoying wearing real shoes! We continue to hear more words and see their individual personalities develop.

Shamila is registered & looking forward to summer English classes at Edmonds College. Nabila is in the process of registering and also looking forward to English classes this summer.

We sincerely appreciate your continued prayers for these families.
