The Parish Finance Council is an advisory and consultative body that assists the Pastor with the responsibility for parish financial management and accountability.

The proposed list of parish families has been released by the Archdiocese of Seattle, listening sessions have begun, and the comments from last week's groups have already been sent to the archdiocese.

One thing the staff noted was a misunderstanding of what is happening in the proposed grouping – St. John Mary Vianney is not closing as a church or its ministries. **The aligning as a family means that the parishioners of the two or three parishes will gather to determine how to use its combined resources – monetary, buildings, and staff.** Your involvement in the next two years will determine what each parish group ends up looking like. We want to hear from you!

#### **CHILDREN AND FAMILY LIFE**

Parish Nursery: On Sundays our nursery is available for children 18 months through 4 years old, and staffed at both the Sunday 9:00am and 11:00am Masses. The nursery is located right down the stairs, parents are welcome to stay with their children if it makes them more comfortable. Audio from Mass can be heard in the nursery.

Children's Liturgy of the Word: Children are invited to join us for dismissal during the regular Sunday 11:00am Mass for Liturgy of the Word. The children hear the gospel reading and have an opportunity to break it open with discussion, activities, and other stories that relate to the Gospel. No registration required and parents are welcome to accompany their children if they'd like.

Mom's Morning Out: Wednesday mornings from 9:30am -12:00pm, primary caregivers of children ages 1-5 can drop their children off in the parish nursery for childcare while the caregiver gets a couple of hours of free time to run errands, relax, clean house, whatever, without a little one under foot. There is a fee of \$15.00 per child per day, and a registration form. Parents with more than two children pay a maximum of \$30.00 per day. There is currently a waiting list for this ministry. Sign up to get on the list today.

<u>Catholic Kids' Catechism Club (CKCC):</u> We begin our faith formation program in October.

Our 3 year old's through kindergarten kids meet downstairs in Room 6 during the 9:00am Mass. Their session begins with learning about the Mass, then they move to Room 2, where they are picked up at the end of Mass. Kids will hear the Gospel for the day, adapted for their little ears, and do activities based on the Gospel.

Our older kids in 1st - 5th grades attend sessions on Sundays between 10:00-11:00am. We open our sessions with the proclamation of the Gospel and then do an opening challenge related to it. Kids then break off with their clubhouses to complete their challenges! They accumulate points throughout the year and the group that gets the highest number of points wins a party at Pump-It-Up at the end of the year!

For active kids, it is a wonderful way to have fun and learn about their faith at the same time. Contact Laura Stanger with questions!

Unfortunately incoming donations are not currently meeting this need and we have been obliged to reduce the amount of support we are able to provide. 
**Quilters Group** Wouldn't it be fun to spend one morning a week learning a new skill? Quilting is one of those rare activities that is fun, relaxing, and


Volunteers are needed in many positions to make the evening happen. Signups are in the Narthex. If you aren't going to attend the auction, please consider helping make it run!

#### RETURN OF THE SHARED COMMUNION CUP

The Precious Blood will return to Mass at SJV the weekend of October 7-8. It is with an abundance of caution that we have waited until this time to offer it again, and reflects the fact that, according to the CDC, "As a nation, we now find ourselves at a different point in the pandemic – with more tools and resources than ever before to better protect ourselves and our communities." Other churches in the archdiocese began using the shared communion cup when the restriction was lifted last year, and there is no scientific evidence indicating the shared cup spreads the COVID-19 virus.

One does not need to receive Holy Communion under both species to receive the full grace of the sacrament (CCC, No. 1390). People are not required to receive and those who wish to do so are not at a greater risk because close contact does not take place.

We recognize the importance of:

- Properly training all ministers to wipe the cup between each person.
- Reminding parishioners that if you are immunocompromised, have respiratory symptoms, or believe you may have been exposed to covid or flu, you should refrain.




All Saints' Day is a Holy Day of Obligation. Masses will be celebrated at 9:00am and 7:00pm.
