## FR. VU TRAN, PASTOR

I am among you as the one who serves. (Luke 22:27)

Dear Beloved in Christ,

With "Partners in the Gospel" at the forefront of the Archdiocese Pastoral Planning effective in July, parishes are being partnered up. We too are not an exception here in Kirkland; the faithful throughout our city must come together, to pray and work together for the Kingdom of God. This is the pastoral plan for the next 3-5 years for both Holy Family Kirkland and SJV.

In a recent meeting with the Archbishop, he encouraged us to focus not on the self, but upon Jesus and his continued work in the world by the grace of the Holy Spirit. It's easy to be distracted, but our attention must always be directed towards Jesus. After all, are we not "A Light of Christ on Finn Hill" for all peoples?

There was a helpful suggestion to prepare for the transition.

- 1.To list all the things that are good and wonderful that are happening at SJV. And to give thanks to God with gratitude for all the gifts God has given, and to celebrate them! Focus on the gifts!
- 2. To list immediate things that we may need to work on; areas for improvement that we can work on at the moment, and the grace, wisdom and courage to take small steps towards those necessary changes.
- 3.To discern future projects and bigger projects we need to consider, these are long term goals.

I believe in God, and also believe that the church is a positive force in the world. I like to continue to focus on the positive values that we provide as a Faith Community (with the grace of God), through Liturgy and prayer, Faith Formation and Education, Outreach, and Communal Life.

While the future is uncertain, it's important to remain positive and continue to hope in God.

Lord, when life is unsettling, keep it steady by your grace of faith and hope. Help us to keep our eyes on you! We know that changes are always difficult, but help us to welcome new changes for the good of Your kingdom!

Jesus I trust in you!

## **CHILDREN AND FAMILY LIFE**

**Parish Nursery:** On Sundays our nursery is available for children 18 months through 4 years old, and staffed at both the Sunday 9:00am and 11:00am Masses. The nursery is located right down the stairs, parents are welcome to stay with their children if it makes them more comfortable. Audio from Mass can be heard in the nursery.

<u>**Children's Liturgy of the Word:**</u> Children are invited to join us for dismissal during the regular Sunday 11:00am Mass for Liturgy of the Word. The children hear the gospel reading and have an opportunity to break it open with discussion, activities, and other stories that relate to the Gospel. No registration required and parents are welcome to accompany their children if they'd like.

**Catholic Kids' Catechism Club (CKCC):** Our 3 year old's through kindergarten kids meet downstairs in Room 6 during the 9:00am Mass. Their session begins with learning about the Mass, then they move to Room 2, where they are picked up at the end of Mass. Kids will hear the Gospel for the day, adapted for their little ears, and do activities based on the Gospel.

Our older kids in 1st - 5th grades attend sessions on Sundays between 10:00-11:00am. We open our sessions with the proclamation of the Gospel and then do an opening challenge related to it. Kids then break off with their clubhouses to complete their challenges! They accumulate points throughout the year and the group that gets the highest number of points wins a party at Pump-It-Up at the end of the year! For active kids, it is a wonderful way to have fun and learn about their faith at the same time. Contact Laura Stanger with questions! **Mom's Morning Out:** Wednesday mornings from 9:30am-12:00pm, primary caregivers of children ages 1-5 can drop their children off in the parish nursery for childcare while the caregiver gets a couple of hours of free time to run errands, relax, clean house, whatever, without a little one under foot. There is a fee of \$15.00 per child per day, and a registration form. Parents with more than two children pay a maximum of \$30 per day. There is currently a waiting list for this ministry. 

#### **AFGHAN REFUGEE FAMILY UPDATE**

First, we are incredibly grateful to those who were aware of and responded so generously to Nabila & Shamila recent housing crisis. The struggle to support three young children each, while learning a new language, and working to bring remaining families members here is very real. We are in awe of how far Nabila and Shamila have both come, and so thankful for your amazing support.

In immigration news, Nabila's husband, Farhad, has received documents and approval from the US Embassy to travel to Seattle. Incredibly their three-year old daughter was refused. Their visas have been extended in Oman so they are able to remain there safely for another month during which time we pray Haya's paperwork will be ironed out.

Nabila has started work part-time at Edmonds College to support her English classes, and her triplets will be eligible to attend the campus early childhood center. Additionally Nabila is applying for housekeeping work at a hotel downtown to meet family expenses.

Shamila continues her new job at a hotel downtown. Because it is the "slow season," she has also applied back to her previous position for additional work hours. She is able to meet her expenses, but needs more of a cushion. We are impressed by Shamila's mastery of the transit system between Lynnwood/Mukilteo and downtown. The entire extended family (16!) took the bus down to Seattle Center on New Years and watched the fireworks at the Space Needle. Her attention has turned to learning to drive. Shamila was able to pay for the "class" portion of drivers ed and then qualified to take the in-vehicle training paid for by DSHS. She drove on I-5 last week! Her three children continue to enjoy school and their English skills are soaring!

Shamila's husband remains in Afghanistan. Paperwork was filed so that he can apply for family reunification. Unfortunately, it is expected to be 1-2 years for this process to unfold. Both Shamila's and Nabila's devotion to their families is an inspiration.

If you are able to help, Nabila is in need of size 4&5 diapers for the triplets. Donations may be dropped off at the SJV office. Your support is greatly appreciated.

The proposed list of parish families was released by the Archdiocese of Seattle and for now we are expecting to be partnered with Holy Family Parish in Kirkland.

During our listening sessions, the staff noted that there was a misunderstanding of what is happening in the proposed grouping – St. John Mary Vianney is not closing as a church or its ministries. The aligning as a family means that the parishioners of the two parishes will gather to determine how to use its combined resources – monetary, buildings, and staff. Your involvement in the next two years will determine what our parish partnership ends up looking like. We want you to be involved and support your parish and its ministries!

## MARRIAGE CONVALIDATION



What's that? Catholics who exchanged vows in the presence of a minister from another religious tradition or had a civil official without a "dispensation from canonical form" are eligible to receive the Sacrament of Marriage through a Convalidation Ceremony.
