"On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb." (John 20)

Dear Beloved in Christ,

Christ is risen, Alleluia, Alleluia! What strikes me in this verse are the words: "While it was still dark." The annual Easter Vigil begins in the darkness (absence of light). The darkness is dispelled by the element of fire, which gives light and warmth. The light begins with the Risen Jesus (Light from Light) and spreads to all who bear the light of Christ in our good but fragile world.

Throughout human history, over and over again, we can see how God has the power and authority to turn darkness into light. Sin and darkness have no power over God who has sovereignty over all. Jesus is our Lord, our Master over all creation, and our entire existence. Because of the Resurrection of Jesus on the First Day, God is victorious!

The beautiful and warm spring weather can be a sign of hope and life for us who have just passed over the recent dark, cold, and dreary winter. Praise be to God! God does amazing things, and can turn the darkness into light, our sadness into joy, our sorrow into gladness, our despair into hope, and death into life.

Our Archdiocese is going through an important and perhaps necessary transition. To breathe the breath of the Spirit into the Faith Communities. Transitions are always difficult, but every transition, great and small, can be seen as a preparation for the final transition to heaven. Someone wisely shared that the only constant is change.

The Archbishop is sending another Pastor for the two faith communities: HFK and SJV. The new Pastor is a very holy, prayerful, smart, and loving priest (100x better than me). He will be with you, and will give good care for you. I ask that you show your loving support to him and the parochial vicar, as you have done for me in the past 7 years. Welcome them as you have for me!

An important thing to consider is that viability of the Faith Community depends upon the value that it offers. Continue to be a positive force in the world, to be a **Light of Christ on Finn Hill for all peoples**. Do so through the faithful celebrations of the Sacraments, promote and support the Faith Formation activities, and generously participate in Outreach activities.

Please keep in mind that we are on the same team for Jesus. I will miss you! I will miss serving our dear Lord with you at SJV. Be assured of my thoughts and prayers, and appreciation for your kindness and heartfelt love.

Annual Catholic Appeal

Thank you to the 296 SJV households who supported the 2023 Annual Catholic Appeal through donations or prayer this is up from 279 last year. As we close on the ACA fiscal year, SJV parishioners pledged a total of \$147,373 which is 153% of the "goal" required by the archdiocese. The monies actually received by the archdiocese that exceed our requirement are rebated back to the parish. The rebate received this year is being used for the youth of our parish to experience the wider Catholic Church. Some Youth Leaders attended RECongress in Anaheim, CA in February. Soon, other Youth will be attending CYO camp, and several from our Young Adults group will represent SJV by attending the Eucharistic Convention in Indiana thanks to your donations.

CHILDREN AND FAMILY LIFE

Parish Nursery: Our nursery is available for children 18 months through 4 years old. Easter Sunday the nursery will be open for you to accompany your child(ren), but not staffed. All other Sundays it is staffed during the 9:00am and 11:00am Masses. The nursery is located downstairs, parents are welcome to stay with their children if it makes them more comfortable. Audio from Mass can be heard in the nursery.

Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW): Children are invited to join us for dismissal during the regular Sunday 11:00am Mass. The children hear the Gospel and have an opportunity to break it open with discussion, activities, and other stories that relate to the Gospel. No registration required and parents are welcome to accompany their children if they'd like. No CLOW on Easter Sunday.

Catholic Kids' Catechism Club (CKCC): Our 3 year old's through kindergarten kids meet downstairs in Room 6 during the 9:00am Mass. Their session begins with learning about the Mass, then they move to Room 2, where they are picked up at the end of Mass. Kids will hear the Gospel for the day, adapted for their little ears, and do activities based on the Gospel.

Our older kids in 1st - 5th grades attend sessions on Sundays between 10:00-11:00am. We open our sessions with the proclamation of the Gospel, then do an opening challenge related to it. Kids then break off with their clubhouses to complete challenges! They accumulate points throughout the year and the group that gets the highest number of points wins a party at Pump-It-Up at the end of the year! For active kids, it is a wonderful way to have fun and learn about their faith at the same time. Contact Laura Stanger with questions!

Mom's Morning Out: Wednesday mornings from 9:30am-12:00pm, primary caregivers of children ages 1-5 can drop their children off in the parish nursery for childcare while the caregiver gets a couple of hours of free time to run errands, relax, clean house, whatever, without a little one under foot. There is a fee of \$15.00 per child per day, and a registration form. Parents with more than two children pay a maximum of \$30 per day. There is currently a waiting list for this ministry. Sign up to get on the list today.

<u>Family Self-Help Resources:</u> We have resources for you and your family to use in times of grief and loss, as well as Safe Touching classes for children and Sexual Abuse Prevention classes for parents and adult volunteers.



They are now working on identifying a country with a US Embassy that will grant a visa for his interview and application processing.

On an unfortunate note, Shamila broke her foot a few weeks ago when a wall safe fell on it while working at the hotel. She has been released to return to her job and is working with her case manager to file a disability claim for the period
