CHILDREN AND FAMILY LIFE

Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW): Children are invited to join us for dismissal during the regular Sunday 11:00am Mass. No registration required and parents are welcome to accompany their children if they'd like.


YOUNG ADULTS FAITH & BREW

There is so much to be thankful for, including your continued prayers and support as they navigate the ups and downs of their journey. It's hard to believe Nabila & Shamila celebrated their third Eid here in Washington. And it was a particularly joyous one!

It has become clear they have a community here. On recent errands with them Aileen, our lead volunteer, told of Nabila & Shamila running into the owner of the new Afghan store at the bank, two of their neighbors at WinCo, multiple people each time they went to the new Afghan store, along with school friends of their children at Ross! The kids enjoy frequenting a nearby halal shop run by a Palestinian Christian, Mr. Saleh who is always thrilled to see them. He generously offers them candy and makes sure they get soda of their choice.

The oldest child will be entering Middle School in September and shared that the middle school counselors came last week and each student was able to select two classes for the fall. He was excited to relate that he and a friend signed up for the same classes, taking Band, Art, and maybe STEM. What a heartwarming feeling knowing they have this wonderful community.

Although the date of Shamila's husband's emigration to the US is still likely a long ways out, her boys were thrilled to find red shoes for him – as that's his favorite color. They are all planning to wear red when he arrives at the airport. They were sure their mom would cry and are open to the idea they might cry too.

What a difference two years makes, indeed!








FLORES DE MAYO
