CHILDREN AND FAMILY LIFE

Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW): Children are invited to join us for dismissal during the regular Sunday 11:00am Mass. The children hear the Gospel and have an opportunity to break it open with discussion, activities, and other stories that relate to the Gospel. No registration required and parents are welcome to accompany their children if they'd like.

<u>Parish Nursery:</u> Our nursery is available for children 18 months through 4 years old. It is staffed Sundays during the 9:00am and 11:00am Masses. The nursery is located downstairs. Parents are welcome to stay with their children if it makes them more comfortable. Audio from Mass can be heard in the nursery.

Catholic Kids' Catechism Club (CKCC): Starting back up in the fall, our 3 year olds through kindergarten kids meet downstairs in Room 6 during the 9:00am Mass. Their session begins with learning about the Mass, then they move to Room 2, where they are picked up at the end of Mass. Kids will hear the Gospel for the day, adapted for their little ears, and do activities based on the Gospel.

Our older kids in 1st - 5th grades attend sessions on Sundays between 10:00-11:00am or Mondays between 7:00-8:00pm. We open our sessions with the proclamation of the Gospel, then do an opening challenge related to it. Kids then break off with their clubhouses to complete challenges! They accumulate points throughout the year and the group that gets the highest number of points wins a party at Pump-It-Up at the end of the year! For active kids, it is a wonderful way to have fun and learn about their faith at the same time. Contact Laura Stanger with questions!

Mom's Morning Out: Wednesday mornings from 9:30am-12:00pm, primary caregivers of children ages 1-5 can drop their children off in the parish nursery for childcare while the caregiver gets a couple of hours of free time to run errands, relax, clean house, whatever without a little one under foot. There is a fee of \$15 per child per day, and a registration form. Parents with more than two children pay a maximum of \$30 per day. There is currently a waiting list for this ministry. Farhad is bright and capable and the company is looking to move him quickly from the warehouse to driver, with an increase in pay, as soon as he secures his drivers' license.

Shamila is celebrating her husband Bilal's upcoming travel to Oman for an asylum interview with the US hembassy. Unfortunately he is unable to secure free housing as their friend in Oman recently emigrated to the US, so Shamila is working extra hours to help pay for a hotel for Bilal while he waits.

PARTNERS IN THE GOSPEL

Partners in Gospel is the next stage of the strategic pastoral planning effort taking place across the Archdiocese of Seattle to re-invigorate and renew our local Catholic Church.

Effective July 1, 2024, St. John Vianney will have new pastoral leadership. Fr. Brad Hagelin has been appointed Pastor, and Fr. Val Park has been appointed Parochial Vicar of our Parish Family (#24) with Holy Family (Kirkland). Each parish family will determine how it will share resources and grow together over a period of about three years.

What's New on May 22, 2024

- Instead of a number, our Parish Family has a name – "Kirkland Catholics" – meaning that we encompass all of Kirkland in one church.
- Both Fr. Brad and Fr. Val will live in the rectory at Holy Family – this decision was made because our rectory is not conducive to having two or more priests living together in community as it has only one suite and a small additional bedroom. We are exploring ministerial uses for our rectory.
- Members from Parish Leadership teams (such as Pastoral Council and Finance Council) will form with members from HFK to create a new Parish Family Advisory Council that will meet regularly to discuss the Partners in the Gospel process. This could form the basis of the new Parish Family Council at a later date, depending on the Pastor's decision.
- A Family Liaison Team consisting of key staff members from SJV and HFK will be formed and meet regularly to discuss a variety of issues as we welcome our new priests and move into the Partners in the Gospel process.
