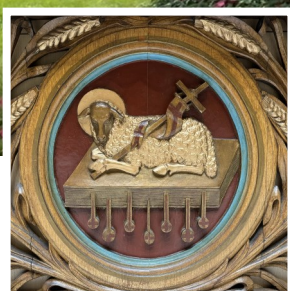

CHILDREN AND FAMILY LIFE

Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW): Children are invited to join us for dismissal during the regular Sunday 11:00am Mass. The children hear the Gospel and have an opportunity to break it open with discussion, activities, and other stories that relate to the Gospel. No registration required and parents are welcome to accompany their children if they'd like.

Parish Nursery: Our nursery is available for children 18 months through 4 years old. It is staffed Sundays during the 9:00am and 11:00am Masses. The nursery is located downstairs. Parents are welcome to stay with their children if it makes them more comfortable. Audio from Mass can be heard in the nursery.

Catholic Kids' Catechism Club (CKCC): Starting back up in the fall, our 3 year olds through kindergarten kids meet downstairs in Room 6 during the 9:00am Mass. Their session begins with learning about the Mass, then they move to Room 2, where they are picked up at the end of Mass. Kids will hear the Gospel for the day, adapted for their little ears, and do activities based on the Gospel.

Our older kids in 1st - 5th grades attend sessions on Sundays between 10:00-11:00am or Mondays between 7:00-8:00pm. We open our sessions with the proclamation of the Gospel, then do an opening challenge related to it. Kids then break off with their clubhouses to complete challenges! They accumulate points throughout the year and the group that gets the highest number of points wins a party at Pump-It-Up at the end of the year! For active kids, it is a wonderful way to have fun and learn about their faith at the same time. Contact Laura Stanger with questions!

Mom's Morning Out: Wednesday mornings from 9:30am-12:00pm, primary caregivers of children ages 1-5 can drop their children off in the parish nursery for childcare while the caregiver gets a couple of hours of free time to run errands, relax, clean house, whatever without a little one under foot. There is a fee of \$15 per child per day, and a registration form. Parents with more than two children pay a maximum of \$30 per day. There is currently a waiting list for this ministry. Sign up to get on the list today.

Family Self-Help Resources: We have resources for you and your family to use in times of grief and loss, as well as Safe Touching classes for children and Sexual Abuse Prevention classes for parents and adult volunteers.

AFGHAN REFUGEE FAMILY UPDATE

We have so much positive news to share!

- Shamila continues to work 5-6 days a week as a house keeper cleaning as many as 20 rooms in one shift! She is not only supporting her family here, but is also supporting her husband, Bilal, during his time in Oman and sending funds to his family in Afghanistan monthly. We are so impressed by Shamila's drive and dedication.
- Bilal arrived in Oman last week to the joy of Shamila and their family! He will go through the process of interviewing at the US Consulate and having a medical evaluation. And then we wait. The reunification process is stressful but we are hopeful it will wrap up before the end of 2024.
- Shamila and Bilal's children all had wonderful school experiences this year. Osman is completing 5th grade and adores his teacher. He is decoding/reading much of what he sees but is still working on vocabulary and comprehension. He is all signed up for Middle School. He was like a kid in a candy store at the school tour, seeing all of the class options. "Band, Tech, Art, Singing...I want all!" Beheshta had a good 2nd grade year and is also progressing well with reading and writing. She is extremely curious and is quite the organizer! She keeps her brothers in line, assures paperwork gets out of backpacks for her mother to read/sign and is a good friend. Omar has grown so much this kindergarten year. He has always had a strong streak and his school had wonderful support teachers to help him gain social, emotional and communication skills in order to shine. He is decoding many words, knows many words by sight and loves to count.
- Nabila's 5 month internship at the Edmonds College food bank provided important work experience. She now has a resume and is considering next steps! She passed another ESL class and will move up a level in summer session.
- Farhad has been here just over ten weeks and already had his one month anniversary as a Truck Assistant for Pacific Seafood in Mukilteo! He has been ALL over King, Pierce, Snohomish, Skagit and Whatcom counties including a ferry ride to the San Juan Islands on his third day! The company is so supportive and will create a driving route (and promotion) for him as soon as he gets his WA license. He was a driver in Afghanistan but in right-hand drive vehicles, so despite passing the tests here already IN ENGLISH, he needs more driving experience before moving up.
- Nabila & Farhad's daughter Haya continues to adjust after just a few months in the country and has a very sweet disposition. She is registered for ECEAP preschool in the Mukilteo SD in September. Unfortunately she arrived with extensive dental issues and has already had three teeth removed. A plan was made with the Seattle Children's team to take care of the remaining teeth shortly.
- Their triplets: Osman, Yalda and Nauman are now 2 1/2! They are still coming along with speaking and are enrolling in Early HeadStart which will provide some support to this family in adjusting to 4 children under 4! Overall their development is on track, which is a blessing. We hope they will be able to start preschool shortly after their third birthday in November.
- Next goals: Shamila has gotten her license thanks to a training program through DSHS. She is saving for a small car which will give her family of 5 some independence once Bilal arrives! Farhad has gotten his license and Nabila is waiting to take the training program. They are saving for a 6-8 passenger vehicle for their family.

We are so grateful for your continued prayers and support of these inspiring families.

Partners in Gospel is a strategic pastoral planning effort taking place across the Archdiocese of Seattle to re-invigorate and renew our local Catholic Church. July 1, the 136 parishes in the Archdiocese of Seattle became 60 parish families, with eight stand-alone parishes. This comes after two years of planning, extensive consultation, and discernment.

Each of these parish families will be led by a pastor or pastoral coordinator, and many will also have a parochial vicar assisting. Together, over the next three years, the parish family will work to form one new canonical parish, while creatively re-envisioning how they will serve their community.
