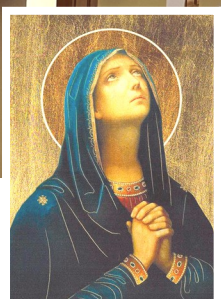
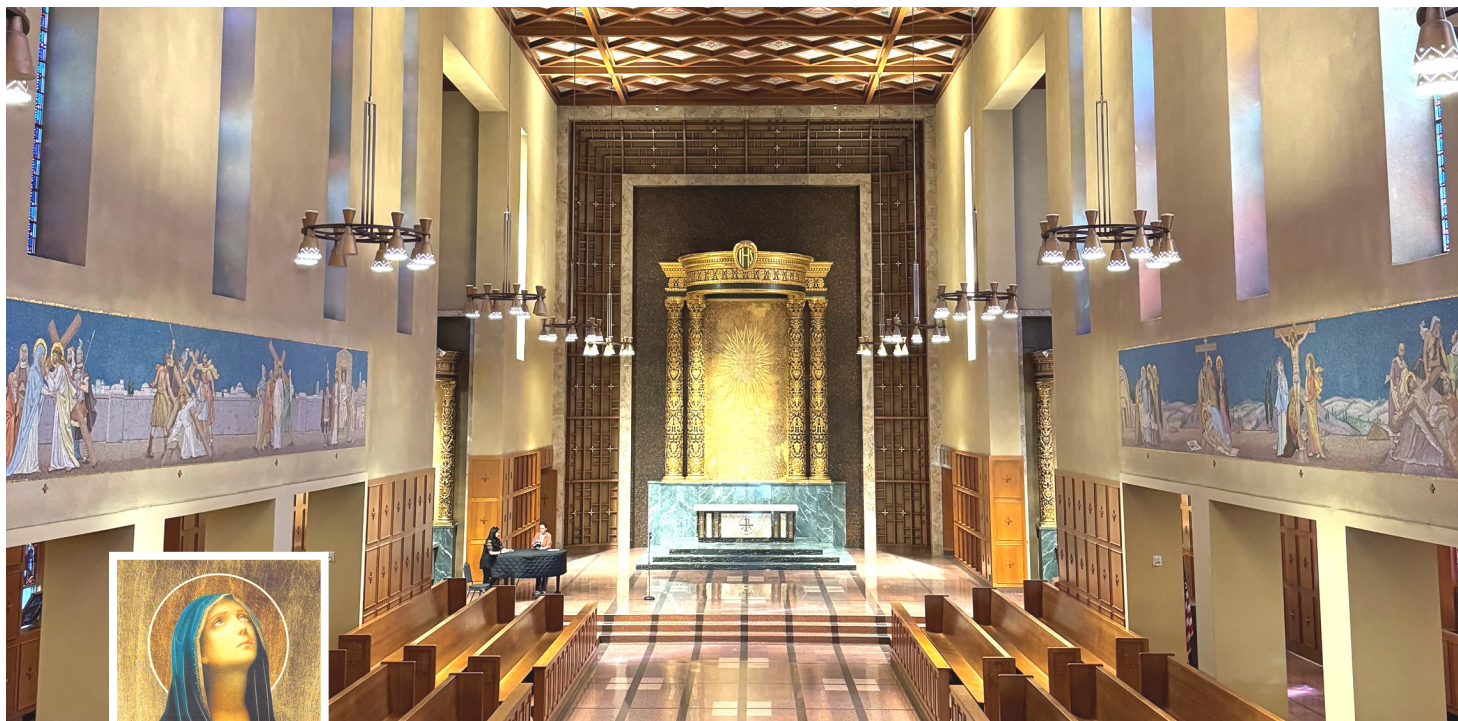

# FR. BRAD HAGELIN

My dear Kirkland Catholics,

I am grateful that there has been openness to this journey of Partners in the Gospel we are now embarking upon in earnest. As summer winds to a close, with school and programs starting, and consultative groups beginning to meet, it feels like SJV and HFK are out of the gates and beginning the work of becoming one parish in about three years.

I want to be very clear at the outset that I am truly and honestly coming into this process with no preconceived ideas of what this is going to look like down the road. Archbishop is absolutely right that “the *status quo* is no longer an option,” but I have no idea what a new normal is supposed to be yet. So...together we must be flexible and open. A brother priest said that if this is to be truly the work of the Holy Spirit we will be **both challenged and surprised** by the outcome. To put it another way, if we are not challenged or surprised then it certainly is NOT the Lord’s work we are doing, and we need to do some deep reflection.

The only real changes made so far this year is that we are combining adult Sacraments of Initiation: RCIA now called OCIA - the whole combined group will meet at HFK first semester, then at SJV second semester; and then a separate Adult Confirmation in the spring, details TBD. I am discerning what it might look like to have a combined youth Confirmation program so that I could be personally involved (I was primary youth Confirmation teacher at my last parish) because my schedule would not permit me to be much involved in two separate programs. We are also currently looking to hire a Pastoral Associate who would be the first shared employee between the two parishes.

Our councils, all youth faith formation and Sacraments, and everything else is remaining separate for now though our Youth Groups may overlap. We will take everything slow, and not “get ahead of the Lord.” Please consistently pray for wisdom and counsel for everyone, especially staff and key leaders in the parishes, specifically for discernment as to what the Lord’s plan is and how to execute it faithfully as we go.

## CHILDREN AND FAMILY LIFE

**Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW):** Children are invited to join us for dismissal during the regular Sunday 11:00am Mass. The children hear the Gospel and have an opportunity to break it open with discussion, activities, and other stories that relate to the Gospel. No registration required and parents are welcome to accompany their children if they'd like.

**Parish Nursery:** Our nursery is available for children 18 months through 4 years old. It is staffed Sundays during the 9:00am and 11:00am Masses. The nursery is located downstairs. Parents are welcome to stay with their children if it makes them more comfortable. Audio from Mass can be heard in the nursery.

**Catholic Kids' Catechism Club (CKCC):** Starting back up in October! Our 3 year olds through kindergarten kids meet downstairs in Room 6 during the 9:00am Mass. Their session begins with learning about the Mass, then they move to Room 2, where they are picked up at the end of Mass. Kids will hear the Gospel for the day, adapted for their little ears, and do activities based on the Gospel.

Our older kids in 1st - 5th grades attend sessions on Sundays between 10:00-11:00am or Mondays between 7:00-8:00pm. We open our sessions with the proclamation of the Gospel, then do an opening challenge related to it. Kids then break off with their clubhouses to complete challenges! They accumulate points throughout the year and the group that gets the highest number of points wins a party at Pump-It-Up at the end of the year! For active kids, it is a wonderful way to have fun and learn about their faith at the same time. Contact Laura Stanger with questions!

**Family Self-Help Resources:** We have resources for you and your family to use in times of grief and loss, as well as Safe Touching classes for children and Sexual Abuse Prevention classes for parents and adult volunteers.

**Mom's Morning Out:** Wednesday mornings from 9:30am-12:00pm, primary caregivers of children ages 1-5 can drop their children off in the parish nursery for childcare while the caregiver gets a couple of hours of free time to run errands, relax, clean house, whatever without a little one under foot. There is a fee of \$15 per child per day, and a registration form. Parents with more than two children pay a maximum of \$30 per day. There is currently a waiting list for this ministry. Sign up to get on the list today.

**Children's Ministry Volunteers:** If you are interested in volunteering for Children's Ministry we would love to have you! Anyone who volunteers to work with children or vulnerable adults must do a criminal background check and complete a safe environment program to keep everyone safe - the volunteers, kids, and the church. We are so very grateful for all of those who are willing to take the steps needed to work with our children by taking the classes and doing the background check. The classes are now done online. Log on to [virtus.org](http://virtus.org) to check your status if you are already a volunteer. There may be some updates you need to make. If you are a new volunteer, log on and create a password. ## AFGHAN REFUGEE FAMILY VERY POSITIVE UPDATES

Nabila has found a new part-time job working in the laundry department at a rehabilitation center. The nature of the work hours will hopefully allow her and Farhad to share childcare, which will be a great cost savings.

On the asylum front: Shamila's husband Bilal has an asylum interview scheduled on September 3. Please keep him in your prayers while his asylum request is being processed, that he will be able to join his family here soon. Shamila and Nabila's brothers' Humanitarian Parole applications have not been denied (which is the most common outcome) so we are still hopeful they may be eventually granted asylum. They face more paperwork and legal fees and are working with our volunteer team to evaluate next steps.

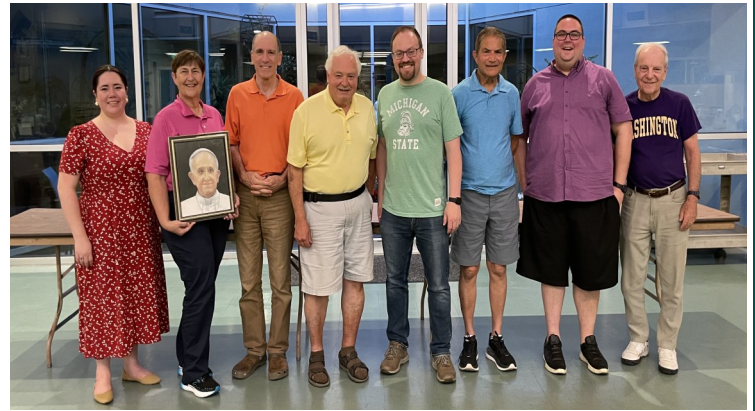
Shamila's children have been taking swim lessons and having a great time at local pools and beaches this summer, as well as taking a chocolate making class and exploring local parks. They are updating vaccines and taking care of doctor, dental, and eye appointments before school starts. They are excited for school to start again, 1st, 3rd and 6th grade, although the oldest is a little nervous about middle school.

Their cousin, Roma, gave birth to a beautiful, healthy 6 lb. baby girl at the beginning of August. Mama and baby are doing well, with much support from their local family.

We are grateful for your continued prayers and support of these inspiring families.

## WHERE DO YOUR GIFTS TO OUR SJV ST. VINCENT DE PAUL GO?

Every day neighbors call our SJV office for help, and each request is responded to by one of our St Vincent de Paul volunteers with a personal phone call in addition to a home or other in-person visit as needed. Thanks to your generous contributions, in the first six months of this year our Vincentians were able to support 54 households (106 people) with \$14,250 in rent payments and 47 households (134 people) with \$10,174 in utility payments. Our Vincentians provided 13 unhoused families (27 people) with motel stays valuing \$2,600, as well as 144 families with over \$10,400 in other support including gas, bus tickets, clothing vouchers, and food.



According to one of our Vincentian volunteers, a homeless woman who recently called requesting help was asked who had referred her to SJV. She replied, "The lady at the Helpline told me that you people are the nicest and most helpful people around and that you usually help right away."

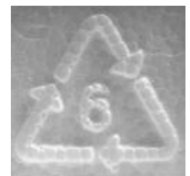

## PARTNERS IN THE GOSPEL

Partners in the Gospel is a strategic pastoral planning effort taking place across the Archdiocese of Seattle to re-invigorate and renew our local Catholic Church.
