

ANNUAL REPORT FY 2023-24

Dear SJV Parishioners,

We are so excited to share this Fiscal Year in review with you. We are amazed at what we have experienced and accomplished. This fiscal year started with us welcoming our new PA of Music, Christina to SJV. We then heard from the Archbishop that Partners in the Gospel was definitely happening and that we would be learning about our proposed partnering in September. After hearing that Holy Family Kirkland was our one and only proposed partner, SJV's Pastoral Council and staff held Synodal-style listening sessions to allow all parishioners an opportunity to be heard and to share corrections of any misperceptions. We continued to be a joyous community celebrating our Parish Picnic, many attended a pilgrimage to Oregon with Fr. Vu, we held our All Saints' Day scavenger hunt and hosted the beautiful ofrenda for the souls of those who have passed before us, enjoyed our Gala dinner and raised bid cards at the auction, and all that the Advent and Christmas season entails. As we moved into the New Year, we learned that we would in fact be partnering with Holy Family and unite all of Kirkland under one parish and we started the First Friday Rosary and procession. In April, we welcomed 8 new Catholics at Easter Vigil and in May and June we celebrated the beauty of the Eucharist with First Communions and Confirmation with 41 young people. Just after Easter, we learned that Fr. Brad Hagelin would be our new Pastor and Fr. Val Park would be our new Parochial Vicar. Throughout all, we continued to celebrate Mass as a community, to volunteer as a community starting new initiatives such as the "Gardening with a Purpose" and supported many worthy causes such as the Afghan Refugee Families, SVdP and Catholic Community Services, our Mission Trekkers, Water Access Now and so many others (more details contained inside). In May, we held our annual golf tournament, and we said goodbye to a priest who ministered to us and loved us for seven years, walking beside many of us through journeys of hardship, sorrow, and love. In June, we grieved and found solace in being a community. In July, we were ready to welcome our new priests and Fathers (remember the dad jokes).

Thank you all for making this a year to remember- walking side by side to support each other in our faith journies.



We successfully ended the Fiscal Year with a positive cash flow - \$67,728. Parishioners contributed 7% more than last FY – largely due to the auction's Fund-a-Need which was used to bridge the expected gap between income and expenses. Last year, the auction and other fundraisers contributed 11% of our total income. Those monies and the deferral of an air flow project kept us within our budget.

The pie charts clearly show that 57% of our income is from stewardship collections and that 56% of our expenses related to salaries and benefits for staff (including preschool). The costs associated with providing our various programs is the second largest part of our expenses coming in at 12%. The assessment by the archdiocese to the parish (in addition to the ACA "goal" and the direct costs tied to services rendered) is another substantial portion of our expenses at 5% of our budget.
