

### FR. BRAD HAGELIN

My dear Kirkland Catholics,

I will be really honest: I very much dislike partisan politics, and especially what it has seemingly done to our country over the past decade or so. Studies have shown that members of the two major political parties have become *far more negative* in their view of members belonging to the "other party" over the past 25 years. Polarization is just about the opposite of what Jesus desires in the Church for sure, but one suspects He probably doesn't desire it in any given society either.

The thing that drives me the craziest is that such a high percentage of politicians seem to care more about winning than being truthful. We cannot do a lot about that as individual citizens, and so the principle of subsidiarity in Catholic Social Teaching has a lot to say about how we are to engage politics, etc. for the common good. That is, we are to put more energy personally in things that have a more immediate and local impact. Let's be honest, my vote for president in Washington State, although important, will not have an actual electoral consequence as Washington is so blue that there is no question about which party will receive Washington's twelve electoral votes.

And so, with voting and with making an impact in our community, we need to be aware of the local issues first, and also do our best to educate ourselves on candidates for races that our vote and energy will have the most impact. For example, the Commissioner for Public Lands primary this year was settled by less than 50 votes. In those types of local and close races we have a serious obligation to really do our homework and vote well. We should do our best to find out as much as we can about people in other races like judges, councilmembers, etc. The Church is clear that we have an obligation to vote, and to vote in an informed way.

The Social Justice Committee put together a packet that I hope you will take and prayerfully reflect upon as you prepare to cast your ballot next month. Let us pray for our country and our leaders as Scripture mandates (1 Timothy 2:1-2; Jeremiah 29:2), especially for greater unity and concern for "the sanctity of human life, the equal dignity of all individuals, the obligation to protect the vulnerable, the nature and purposes of sex, marriage, and family." #### CHILDREN AND FAMILY LIFE

Parish Nursery: Our nursery is available for children 18 months through 4 years old. It is staffed Sundays during the 9:00am and 11:00am Masses. The nursery is located downstairs. Parents are welcome to stay with their children if it makes them more comfortable. Audio from Mass can be heard in the nursery.

Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW): Children are invited to join us for dismissal during the regular Sunday 11:00am Mass. The children hear the Gospel and have an opportunity to break it open with discussion, activities, and other stories that relate to the Gospel. No registration required and parents are welcome to accompany their children if they'd like.

Mom's Morning Out: Wednesday mornings from 9:30am-12:00pm, primary caregivers of children ages 1-5 can drop their children off in the parish nursery for childcare while the caregiver gets a couple of hours of free time to run errands, relax, clean house, whatever without a little one under foot. There is a fee of \$15 per child per day, and a registration form. Parents with more than two children pay a maximum of \$30 per day. There is currently a waiting list for this ministry. Sign up to get on the list today.

Children's Ministry Volunteers: If you are interested in volunteering for Children's Ministry we would love to have you! Anyone who volunteers to work with children or vulnerable adults must do a criminal background check and complete a safe environment program to keep everyone safe - the volunteers, kids, and the church. We are so very grateful for all of those who are willing to take the steps needed to work with our children by taking the classes and doing the background check. The classes are now done online. Log on to virtus.org to check your status if you are already a volunteer. There may be some updates you need to make. If you are a new volunteer, log on and create a password. If you have any questions please ask Laura Stanger in the office.

<u>Family Self-Help Resources:</u> We have resources for you and your family to use in times of grief and loss, as well as Safe Touching classes for children and Sexual Abuse Prevention classes for parents and adult volunteers.

Catholic Kids' Catechism Club (CKCC): Starting this month! Our 3 year olds through kindergarten kids meet downstairs in Room 6 during the 9:00am Mass. Their session begins with learning about the Mass, then they move to Room 2, where they are picked up at the end of Mass. Kids will hear the Gospel for the day, adapted for their little ears, and do activities based on the Gospel.

Our older kids in 1st - 5th grades attend sessions on Sundays between 9:55-10:55am or Mondays between 7:00-8:00pm. We open our sessions with the proclamation of the Gospel, then do an opening challenge related to it. Kids then break off with their clubhouses to complete challenges! They accumulate points throughout the year and the group that gets the highest number of points wins a party at Pump-It-Up at the end of the year! For active kids, it is a wonderful way to have fun and learn about their faith at the same time. Contact Laura Stanger with questions! We are kicking off our year on October 6 but kids can register at any time. We are in need of volunteers for all of our Groups. 

#### **FAITH & BREW**







### Stewardship of Treasure Yearly Planning Guide

#### **GOOD STEWARDSHIP OF TREASURE PRACTICES:**

#### Planned

A decision requiring thought & time so as not to give what is merely left at the end of a week.

#### Proportionate

Our giving is proportionate to what God has given to us. We give in proportion to the gifts we have received.

#### Sacrificial

We give back from our substance, rather than our abundance.

#### Grateful

Acknowledging that God is the source of all our gifts, we freely, without reservation or condition, give back to Him by sharing these gifts.

"Bring the full tithe into the storehouse, so that there may be food in my house, and thus put me to the test, says the Lord of hosts; see if I will not open the windows of heaven for you and pour down for you an overflowing blessing."

Malachi 3:10

STEP 1—DETERMINE YEARLY INCOME = \$(include retirement disbursements as well as investment income)
STEP 2—DETERMINE % OF INCOME TO GIVE = \$
Biblical tithe is 10% with 5% suggested to the church. You may want to work up to a biblical tithing amount over several years.
