My dear Kirkland Catholics,

November is the final month of the church year because Advent inaugurates each new church year. November appropriately is the month in which we focus on "The Four Last Things," which is to say: death, judgment, heaven and hell. And so we began this month with the celebration of All Saints, focusing on all those who have gone before us and are with the Lord in heaven. On All Souls Day we are reminded that there are those – including perhaps our loved ones – who remain in purgatory, and *thus* are in need of our prayers.

To sum up, we focus this month on our own inevitable death, and the inevitability of our particular judgment. As Catholics, the main question to ask ourselves in November is: "If I were to die this month, am I ready to meet the Lord?"

- Have I said "I love you" to my loved ones?
- Have I showed appreciation to the significant people in my life and thanked them for what they have done for me?
- Have I apologized to people I have actually and specifically wronged or neglected, but never asked forgiveness from?
- Have I made a good confession recently?
- Have I put God *first* by making daily prayer time a non-negotiable?
- Which friend have I not connected with in a long time that I should reach out to and catch up with?
- Is there someone the Lord has been putting on my heart who I should attempt to reconcile with?

Each Mass actually focuses us on "The Four Last Things" and what's actually important in light of God's grace. Singing reminds us of our unity and diversity and heaven. The Penitential Rite stresses our need for forgiveness. The Liturgy of the Word points out God's promises and salvation history. The Creed emphasizes our core beliefs. The intercessions recollect our need to ask God for what we lack. The Presentation of the Gifts calls to mind our stewardship and what we are to offer back to God. The Eucharistic prayer is all about what Jesus did and why, and our own connection to the Paschal mystery. Holy Communion reminds us that we are called into deeper communion with Jesus and others every day. Finally, the dismissal calls us to announce the Gospel to our neighbors in word and deed.

The liturgy focuses us on the essentials in light of our baptismal calling and destiny. May November help us to reflect more deeply on our destiny and the Lord's goodness.

CHILDREN AND FAMILY LIFE

<u>Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW):</u> Children are invited to join us for dismissal during the regular Sunday 11:00am Mass. The children hear the Gospel and have an opportunity to break it open with discussion, activities, and other stories that relate to the Gospel. No registration required and parents are welcome to accompany their children if they'd like.

<u>Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW):</u> Children are invited to join us for dismissal during the regular Sunday 11:00am Mass. The children hear the Gospel and have an opportunity to break it open with discussion, activities, and other stories that relate to the Gospel. No registration required and parents are welcome to accompany their children if they'd like.

Mom's Morning Out: Wednesday mornings from 9:30am-12:00pm, primary caregivers of children ages 1-5 can drop their children off in the parish nursery for childcare while the caregiver gets a couple of hours of free time to run errands, relax, clean house, whatever without a little one under foot. There is a fee of \$15 per child per day, and a registration form. Parents with more than two children pay a maximum of \$30 per day. There is currently a waiting list for this ministry. Sign up to get on the list today.

Children's Ministry Volunteers: If you are interested in volunteering for Children's Ministry we would love to have you! Anyone who volunteers to work with children or vulnerable adults must do a criminal background check and complete the Safe Environment Program to keep everyone safe - the volunteers, kids, and the church. We are so very grateful for all of those who are willing to take the steps needed to work with our children. The classes are now done online. Log on to virtus.org to check your status if you are already a volunteer. There may be some updates you need to make. If you are a new volunteer, log on and create a password. If you have any questions please ask Laura Stanger in the office.

Parish Nursery: Our nursery is available for children 18 months through 4 years old. It is staffed Sundays during the 9:00am and 11:00am Masses. The nursery is located downstairs. Parents are welcome to stay with their children if it makes them more comfortable. Audio from Mass can be heard in the nursery.

<u>Family Self-Help Resources:</u> We have resources for you and your family to use in times of grief and loss, as well as Safe Touching Classes for children and Sexual Abuse Prevention classes for parents and adult volunteers.

Catholic Kids' Catechism Club (CKCC): Our 3 year olds through kindergarten kids meet downstairs in Room 6 during the 9:00am Mass. Their session begins with learning about the Mass, then they move to Room 2, where they are picked up at the end of Mass. Kids will hear the Gospel for the day, adapted for their little ears, and do activities based on the Gospel.

Our older kids in 1st - 5th grades attend sessions on Sundays between 9:55-10:55am or Mondays between 7:00-8:00pm. We open our sessions with the proclamation of the Gospel, then do an opening challenge related to it. Kids then break off with their clubhouses to complete challenges! They accumulate points throughout the year and the group that gets the highest number of points wins a party at Pump-It-Up at the end of the year! For active kids, it is a wonderful way to have fun and learn about their faith at the same time. Contact Laura Stanger with questions!

All Saints Scavenger Hunt: During the Month of November CKCC will be learning about the Saints! Everyone in the parish is invited to our All Saints Scavenger Hunt on Sunday, November 3 from Noon-3:00pm. If the weather is nice it will be outside.










We are collaborating with Holy Family for our **High School Retreat on November 15-17** at Hope Lodge on at Stevens Pass. **Registration is open until November 7**.

PARTNERS IN THE GOSPEL

Partners in Gospel is a strategic pastoral planning effort taking place across the Archdiocese of Seattle to reinvigorate and renew our local Catholic Church.

July 1, the 136 parishes in the Archdiocese of Seattle became 60 parish families, with eight stand-alone parishes. This comes after two years of planning, extensive consultation, and discernment.

Each of these parish families will be led by a pastor or pastoral coordinator, and many will also have a parochial vicar assisting. Together, over the next three years, the parish family will work to form one new canonical parish, while creatively re-envisioning how they will serve their community.

St. John Vianney is now a parish family with Holy Family in Kirkland.

Dia De Los Muertos, or Day of the Dead is traditionally observed on November 1 and 2. It is a Mexican holiday that honors and celebrates the temporary return of the souls of the deceased, who return to the world of the living to be with relatives, and nourished by the essence of the food offered to them in the altars placed in their honor. In the celebration of the Day of the Dead, death does not represent an absence but a living presence; death is a symbol of

life that materializes on the altar offered.

The altar or offering of the Day of the Dead is one of the most deeply rooted traditions among Mexicans. The celebration of the Day of the Dead dates back to pre-Hispanic times, in which the cult of death was one of the basic elements of culture. When someone died, they were buried wrapped in a petate (bedroll), and their relatives organized a party in order to guide them on their journey to the Mictlán, a portal between life and death. They offered food that they liked in life, with the belief that they could feel hungry on their journey. It was in colonial times that the indigenous celebration was mixed with the Catholic celebrations of All Saints and All Souls.



This year, SJV takes part in the festivities with our Hispanic brothers and sisters in Christ, with our Ofrenda. Thank you to **Rosario, Carolina, Paulina, Angie, Consuelo, and Miranda** for thoughtfully preparing the Ofrenda for our deceased loved ones.

What do the three levels of the altar mean?

The levels of the altar of the dead represent the strata of existence. Our three-level altar represents the earth, the sky, and the underworld or purgatory. The seven-level altar is considered to be the most traditional; each level symbolizing the steps necessary for souls to rest in peace.

These are the elements that should not be missing in a three-level Day of the Dead offering:

- Images of the deceased, which are placed in the highest part of the altar.
- A cross, which goes next to the images of the deceased.
- An image of souls from purgatory to speed up the deliverance of spirits of the dead in that instance.
- Copal or incense, which serves to purify and clean.
- Arch represents the entrance to the world of the dead and is adorned with flowers, and in some cases fruits.
- Confetti represents the joy of the Day of the Dead.
- Candles represent the guiding light.
- Water reflects the purity of the soul. it also serves for the spirits to quench their thirst. You can also put soap or a towel on the side, so that the deceased can wash.
- Cempasúchil (marigolds) serve as a guide to the spirits in this world.
- Skulls made of sugar, chocolate, or amaranth represent that death can be sweet, and serves as a reminder that death is always among us.
- Seeds and fruits represent the earth.
- Food must be to the liking of the deceased, who can only enjoy them once a year.
- Bread represents the Eucharist.
- Alcoholic beverages, generally shots of tequila, pulque, or mezcal, to toast the arrival of the ancestors.
- Salt is the element of purification. It keeps the body from corruption on its round trip for the following year.
- Another element of purification is the ash cross that serves to purify the spirit of the dead of their pending faults.

What is the purpose of the tapete (rug of sand)

This acts as a welcome mat to pay tribute to those who have already died and started their journey to Mictlán, the portal between life and death. The sand, similar to the ashes on our foreheads on Ash Wednesday, also reminds us that "you are dust, and to dust you shall return."
