FR. BRAD HAGELIN

My dear Kirkland Catholics,

This weekend we begin a homily series on Discipleship that will take place over the next 7 weeks preparing us for Lent. Fr. Val and I will both preach on the same aspect of discipleship each weekend in our respective locations. This weekend the focus is on identity – that in Jesus we are adopted children of God. Jesus as Lord and older brother is the one then who teaches us how to live as Children of the Father. A disciple then sits at the feet of the Lord Jesus and listens as He reveals both general principles that lead to our flourishing (The Sermon on the Mount beginning in Matthew chapter 5 is a good compendium) and a **specific calling** particular to our own destiny and walk with Him. Jesus lays down an important truth "apart from me you can do nothing" (John 15:5). Nothing of any lasting value at least. I expect this homily series will be both enlightening and challenging as we consider whether our lives actually revolve around the Lord. Is Jesus part of my life, or the center of my life? And if only part of my life, what concepts do I need to understand, actions do I need to take, or


priorities do I need to change to earnestly strive to make Him the center?

CHILDREN AND FAMILY LIFE

<u>Parish Nursery:</u> Our nursery is available for children 18 months through 4 years old. It is staffed Sundays during the 9:00am and 11:00am Masses. The nursery is located downstairs. Parents are welcome to stay with their children if it makes them more comfortable. Audio from Mass can be heard in the nursery.

Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW): Children are invited to join us for dismissal during the regular Sunday 11:00am Mass. The children hear the Gospel and have an opportunity to break it open with discussion, activities, and other stories that relate to the Gospel. No registration required and parents are welcome to accompany their children if they'd like.

Mom's Morning Out: Wednesday mornings from 9:30am-12:00pm, primary caregivers of children ages 1-5 can drop their children off in the parish nursery for childcare while the caregiver gets a couple of hours of free time to run errands, relax, clean house, whatever without a little one under foot. There is a fee of \$15 per child per day, and a registration form. Parents with more than two children pay a maximum of \$30 per day. There is currently a waiting list for this ministry. Sign up to get on the list today.

Children's Ministry Volunteers: If you are interested in volunteering for Children's Ministry we would love to have you! Anyone who volunteers to work with children or vulnerable adults must do a criminal background check and complete the Safe Environment Program to keep everyone safe - the volunteers, kids, and the church. We are so very grateful for all of those who are willing to take the steps needed to work with our children. The classes are now done online. Log on to virtus.org to check your status if you are already a volunteer. There may be some updates you need to make. If you are a new volunteer, log on and create a password. If you have any questions please ask Laura Stanger in the office.

<u>Family Self-Help Resources:</u> We have resources for you and your family to use in times of grief and loss, as well as Safe Touching Classes for children and Sexual Abuse Prevention classes for parents and adult volunteers.

Catholic Kids' Catechism Club (CKCC): Our 3 year olds through kindergarten kids meet downstairs in Room 6 during the 9:00am Mass. Their session begins with learning about the Mass, then they move to Room 2, where they are picked up at the end of Mass. Kids will hear the Gospel for the day, adapted for their little ears, and do activities based on the Gospel.

Our older kids in 1st - 5th grades attend sessions on Sundays between 9:55-10:55am or Mondays between 7:00-8:00pm. We open our sessions with the proclamation of the Gospel, then do an opening challenge related to it. Kids then break off with their clubhouses to complete challenges! They accumulate points throughout the year and the group that gets the highest number of points wins a party at Pump-It-Up at the end of the year! For active kids, it is a wonderful way to have fun and learn about their faith at the same time. Contact Laura Stanger with questions!

CKCC Blessing Bags for the Homeless: Thank you so much for your donations to the blessing bags! The shelters were so excited and used the word "abundance" when they saw all that was donated. These little things that we put together mean a lot to the people who receive them. It reminds the receivers that they are not forgotten... they are remembered and with all that we have and all that we are blessed with, these small blessing bags give other people hope. They were also a reminder to our kids who filled them of the gift of their homes, their families, and the abundance that they have in their lives. Thank you for your generosity.

At St. John Vianney Catholic Church, our Children's Faith Formation Program has always focused on nurturing our children through stimulating, faith filled, and fun programs. These programs; Catholic Kids' Catechism Club, Children's Liturgy of the Word, Sacramental Preparation, Mom's Morning Out, and Vacation Bible School, celebrate each child as a wonderful gift from God, while fostering growth in the development of education, faith and community.

SJV Catholic Preschool serves as an extension to our Faith Formation Program, adopting the same focus and philosophies, while providing a more structured/play-based program for 3 to 5 year olds. We accept children of all faith backgrounds.

Our 3's class

(3 years old on or before 12/31/25)

A wonderful 1st preschool experience. Our 3's class focuses on social interaction, emotional, physical and spiritual growth in a warm and welcoming learning environment.

Our 3+ class

(4 years old on or before 12/31/25)

We are developing a sense of community where we learn to play, share and communicate with one another. Learning to follow directions, art, circle and story time keep us busy. This class includes a 20 min. lunch period.

Storybook Adventure

(4 years old on or before 12/31/25)

This amazing addition to our current program will take your child on a journey reading and exploring a variety of Children's stories and picture books. We will read, write, illustrate and act out special and new favorites. *Priority will be given to our registered 4's & 3+ students*.

Our 4's class

(4 years old on or before 8/31/25)

This class will give your child the option to move up to our Pre-K class or graduate to kindergarten in 2026. We offer a play/theme-based curriculum which includes STEM, pre-reading, math and writing activities. We are adding on to the 3+ curriculum with a more academic emphasis. This class incudes a 20 min. lunch period.




Our Pre-K class


(5 years old on or before 12/31/25)





FACILITIES WORKSHOP

Fund-a-Need Update from our Auction this year - \$31,000 was raised to be used for several good-sized projects we need around here. First and foremost is the church sound system. We are working with Morgan Sound, a well known and respected company in this area, and have replaced some of our aging handheld mics as well as the priests' beltpack mics. With their technician's help, the sound clarity has been improved in house and on our livestream broadcasts. The goal is to delay having to replace our existing system with an entire new one. Our components are so old they cannot get parts for them. Fingers crossed and a lot of praying! So far, so good. Next is to install security cameras inside and outside to enhance our coverage. After that we have several building and maintenance issues to repair/upgrade that have been subject to the last 30+ years of wear and tear. I will keep you posted on what projects are being completed.


