

LENT BEGINS ON ASH WEDNESDAY, MARCH S

My dear Kirkland Catholics,

It is not often that Lent evades February because Easter is so late that Ash Wednesday lands in March. This means that an entire month of ordinary time in February is rare. Each of the months of the year the Catholic Church dedicates to a particular devotion or prayer focus.

- March St. Joseph
- April The Blessed Sacrament
- May Mary
- June Sacred Heart of Jesus
- July The Precious Blood
- August The Immaculate Heart of Mary
- September Our Lady of Sorrows
- October The Holy Rosary
- November The Poor Souls in Purgatory
- December The Immaculate Conception
- January The Holy Name of Jesus

And February ... is **The Holy Family**. Today's theme in the homily series is virtue. If you have children at home and are looking for specific ideas of helping your family establish virtue and imitate the Holy Family and aspire to the call that our families be "the Domestic Church," The Knights of Columbus have sponsored a really well done website and free program called "Family Fully Alive" which has a ton of resources and ideas. It will be the first or second internet search result if you put "Family Fully Alive" into a search engine.

If you do not have children at home, but are looking to make your home a place more conducive to the virtue of prayer, I highly recommend – if at all possible – spending quiet prayer time almost always in the same place and the same (comfy) chair. That nook and chair will over time be conducive (even consecrated) for you entering into prayer more easily so that, like Mary in today's Gospel, you can better "ponder" in your heart with God about what He is up to in your life (discernment – last week's discipleship habit).

We are almost halfway through another school year and our amazing preschool staff makes sure all classes are running smoothly and the little ones as well as their parents are happy. We are looking forward to a variety of upcoming field trips and fun events throughout the next few months.

Registration for the 2025/26 school year is winding down and thanks to your prayers, encouragement, and advertising SJV Preschool to your family, friends, and neighbors, enrollment is going very well. Our wonderful early literacy program. "Storybook Adventure" which supplements our 4's class is still a favorite among students and teachers.

CHILDREN AND FAMILY LIFE

Parish Nursery: Our nursery is available for children 18 months through 4 years old. It is staffed Sundays during the 9:00am and 11:00am Masses. The nursery is located downstairs. Parents are welcome to stay with their children if it makes them more comfortable. Audio from Mass can be heard in the nursery.

Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW): Children are invited to join us for dismissal during the regular Sunday 11:00am Mass. The children hear the Gospel and have an opportunity to break it open with discussion, activities, and other stories that relate to the Gospel. No registration required and parents are welcome to accompany their children if they'd like.

Children's Ministry Volunteers: If you are interested in volunteering for Children's Ministry we would love to have you! Anyone who volunteers to work with children or vulnerable adults must do a criminal background check and complete the Safe Environment Program to keep everyone safe - the volunteers, kids, and the church. We are so very grateful for all of those who are willing to take the steps needed to work with our children. The classes are now done online. Log on to virtus.org to check your status if you are already a volunteer. There may be some updates you need to make. If you are a new volunteer, log on and create a password. If you have any questions please ask Laura Stanger in the office.

Family Self-Help Resources: We have resources for you and your family to use in times of grief and loss, as well as Safe Touching Classes for children and Sexual Abuse Prevention classes for parents and adult volunteers.



VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL is scheduled to begin JUNE 23. Mark your calendar! Hopefully the date will stick! As long as the school schedule stays and we do not have any extended days!

Catholic Kids' Catechism Club (CKCC): Our 3 year olds through kindergarten kids meet downstairs in Room 6 during the 9:00am Mass. Their session begins with learning about the Mass, then they move to Room 2, where they are picked up at the end of Mass. Kids will hear the Gospel for the day, adapted for their little ears, and do activities based on the Gospel.

Our older kids in 1st - 5th grades attend sessions on Sundays between 9:55-10:55am or Mondays between 7:00-8:00pm. We open our sessions with the proclamation of the Gospel, then do an opening challenge related to it. Kids then break off with their clubhouses to complete challenges! They accumulate points throughout the year and the group that gets the highest number of points wins a party at Pump-It-Up at the end of the year! For active kids, it is a wonderful way to have fun and learn about their faith at the same time. Contact Laura Stanger with questions!

Our CKCC group did a scavenger hunt following Stars to celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany. They left some lovely gifts for Jesus in the Adoration Chapel, including: Love, Prayer, their heart, going to confession, being more patient, making good choices, to pray more, to focus more on the Mass, trying not to yell, read more about the Saints, be more kind, and love and respect my elders.

They will also be getting geared up with Training Camp for Superbowl Sundae! A very important part of Catechism Club! Let the wild rumpus start!

Mom's Morning Out: Wednesday mornings from 9:30am-12:00pm, primary caregivers of children ages 1-5 can drop their children off in the parish nursery for childcare while the caregiver gets a couple of hours of free time to run errands, relax, clean house, whatever without a little one under foot. There is a fee of \$15 per child per day, and a registration form. Parents with more than two children pay a maximum of \$30 per day. There is currently a waiting list for this ministry. Sessions are scheduled at 7:00pm on Friday nights and 10:00am on Saturday mornings. We offer the same class session twice for your convenience. If Friday night works well one week and Saturday morning works better the next, come to whichever day fits best for you!

AFGHAN REFUGEE FAMILY UPDATE

As we enter 2025, the Sisters have each completed their first full years of work! Shamila has earned paid vacation time and thinks it's pretty great. They and their husbands are learning about tax returns. We hope will each get a small refund as Nov-Feb are slow months of earnings in the service industries.

As we look forward, it's also important to look back at the past 3 years, not in the abstract but with actual humans with all the complexity, success, messes and joy that entails. The St. John Vianney support community has learned so much by engaging with this process. There was so much unknown about how counties, our state and the nation manage the immigrant and refugee process.

The Sisters - like all refugees - received a range of government supports when they arrived. Due to war and unrest in Ukraine and Syria among others, the Afghan refugees were not the only group arriving in very large numbers in 2021 and 2022.

The fall of Kabul revealed that the federal infrastructure for managing refugee services had been dismantled by the previous administration. In the summer/fall 2021, it was operating at 10% of previous capacity, which given the exponential needs made a difficult process chaotic at best. Despite having dedicated and hard-working staff, local aid agencies charged with administering federal grants (i.e. Catholic Community Services, Lutheran Services, Jewish World Services, Muslim Housing, International Rescue Committee, World Relief etc.) were woefully understaffed and lacking key aspects of expertise needed to be effective and efficient.

Government supports decrease steadily for refugees as they do for all state and federal aid recipients due to a straightforward formula: the more you work, the less you receive. It's largely impossible to remain housed in Washington state and elsewhere unless you work at least one job because the average rent nationally is \$1730 per month. Food supports have returned to prepandemic levels which resulted in a significant cut for most recipients. The monthly federal "cash" support (never more than \$770 for the Sisters) goes away within 6 months of starting work. Working is always better because the "cash" has not been enough to live on for decades. In summary, food support is just that. Support. It doesn't come close to meeting all needs and explicitly doesn't cover personal care items such as diapers, toilet paper, hygiene, and cleaning products. In addition, lack of personal transportation, English fluency and abundant time impacts the ability to be a "thrifty" shopper.


It was eye opening to see that for most refugee families the federal housing support is only provided for 3 months. Housing is the most challenging aspect of resettling, and the expectation is that these newcomers would find housing and acquire sufficient language skills to support themselves in 3 months is optimistic to say the least. In the past 2 years we have seen dozens and dozens of folks in the Sisters' apartment complex (including Shamila and Nabila) receive eviction notices and too many become unhoused. Fortunately, because of the non-governmental safety net in place, Nabila and Shamila weathered their eviction process and have tenuous stability.

The Sisters, other than a small amount of federal food support each month and health insurance, have not been eligible for state or federal aid for over a year. This does not mean they meet their own needs. They rely on food banks to supplement the needs of their large families and having their own vehicles now allows them to access programs independently. They also access subsidized utility programs where they can, and are fortunate and grateful to have had a "safety net" from supporters that has helped bridge specific situations.

Shamila's husband Bilal is seeking work. He is a trained mechanic having worked on "large vehicles" in the military as well as personal vehicles. We have observed that he is fastidious and thorough in his work with their home and car being even more sparkly since his arrival! He is already an asset to the Afghan community in their complex, having repaired a number of issues for new friends. English is a barrier, and he won't be able to take formal classes until summer due to wait lists, but translate software is available and he is literate in Farsi, Dari, and Pashto. We hope that he is able to find work utilizing his skills (mechanic, detailing). He may be able to get work at the hotel with Shamila when the need for employees picks up in March. In closing, there is a lot of rhetoric around if and what responsibility we bear to assist and support those on the margins in our community and our country. Volunteering through SJV to help newcomers reveals that they need to get on track to supporting themselves remarkably quickly. Lessons about systems and structures that American children and youth have the opportunity to gain over a period of years, must be learned in a period of months in a new country and language and in the context of trauma. Because of the generosity of Shamila's initial Host family in Seattle and the SJV community in Kirkland, both Sisters have had more tangible, emotional and spiritual support than most over the past 3 years. They are literate and completed basic and some university education before arriving. Still, it is clear the ability "pull yourself up by the bootstraps" is a myth in our current economy and housing situation where more than 60% of income goes to housing alone. Families are complex and even in the best situations, the "unexpected" come up and can derail stability and progress forward. This is true for newcomers as well as long term neighbors. We have the opportunity at SJV to continue to embrace all our community; those already recognized at members and particularly those on the margins. Father Gregory Boyle, SJ, captures this:

"If we love what God loves, then, in compassion, margins get erased. 'Be compassionate as God is compassionate,' means the dismantling of barriers that exclude." And also, "You don't go to the margins to make a difference. You go so the folks at the margins make you different."

The State of Washington's Migrant and Asylum Seeker Support Project, https://washington-mass-hub.zendesk.com/hc/en-us covers assistance for immigrants who arrived in Washington state after December 2021 and do not have work permits. They offer screening and referral for services for those who qualify and have a resource directory organized by county.

According to ancient Jewish tradition, a new mother had to be purified forty days after giving birth, then present her baby at the temple.
