FR. BRAD HAGELIN

My dear Kirkland Catholics,

I wanted to share with you some exciting news, explain why I believe Youth Ministry is crucial today, and ask for your prayers. There's almost no way to overstate the impact "the Alaska trip" had on the youth of my last parish. A week of fun, outside of cell-service range, but also with Mass every day, adoration most days, and confession on-demand. My first pastor's column ever was a recap of last year (https://nkparish.com/alaska-info). The Holy Spirit unfailingly showed up in different but powerful ways each year we did this trip. "Amazing" and "life-changing" are the two most common ways youth would characterize the trip when they returned.

Many became involved with youth group moving forward, which would not have otherwise happened for a lot of them without the relationships they formed with peers and adult leaders in Alaska. This is important because my observation is *youth-group-involved-kids* fall away from the faith at a much lower rate in college and young adult-hood than youth who even attended a Catholic high school but never became involved in youth group at their parish (or never went to Alaska in the case of my 11 years at St. Luke). It is important for youth to have faith-filled adults (other than their parents) in their lives who they feel a strong connection with. Studies have shown a very strong statistical correlation between faithful, non-relative adults in a youth's life and a youth embracing the faith when they reach adulthood (google "Sticky Faith" for more info). Youth ministry at both campuses will endeavor to create this atmosphere to support parents in raising their kids in the Faith.

The exciting news *is*, together with Fr. Chad Green who was vicar at HFK for a couple years not too long ago, we are offering the Alaska trip to HFK/SJV senior high youth along with St. Luke and Christ the King Youth (where Fr. Chad is pastor). Incoming high school freshman up to incoming college freshman are eligible. We will be going to St. Therese's camp in Wasilla, Alaska outside Anchorage. We realize this is a late offering because - despite concerted efforts since late December – we only finally were able to lock down dates with a camp. If you would have liked for your child to go but it is not possible because of other plans, we promise to do

our best in the coming years to get dates out sooner.

If you have a high schooler, I encourage you to encourage your teen to consider. In 8 years doing this trip, I don't believe we ever had a single kid regret going, and it was transformational for a majority of incoming juniors and seniors. If you do not have kids in this range, I still have a special ask. Will you please pray for the youth in our parish family? Since COVID we have seen a significant decline in youth ministry involvement, and I believe this must change. We know the challenges they face in terms of Faith today, and they are our future; so please simply pray for all the youth in our parish family, and the success of the SJV Trek and the Alaska Trip this summer.

CHILDREN AND FAMILY LIFE

Parish Nursery: Our nursery is available for children 18 months through 4 years old. It is staffed Sundays during the 9:00am and 11:00am Masses. The nursery is located downstairs. Parents are welcome to stay with their children if it makes them more comfortable. Audio from Mass can be heard in the nursery.

Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW): Children are invited to join us for dismissal during the Sunday 11:00am Mass. The children hear the Gospel and have an opportunity to break it open with discussion, activities, and other stories that relate to the Gospel. No registration required and parents are welcome to accompany their children if they'd like.

Children's Ministry Volunteers: If you are interested in volunteering for Children's Ministry we would love to have you! Anyone who volunteers to work with children or vulnerable adults must do a criminal background check and complete the Safe Environment Program to keep everyone safe - the volunteers, kids, and the church. We are so very grateful for all of those who are willing to take the steps needed to work with our children. The classes are now done online. Log on to virtus.org to check your status if you are already a volunteer, there may be some updates you need to make. If you are a new volunteer, log on and create a password. If you have any questions please ask Laura Stanger in the office.

Mom's Morning Out: Wednesday mornings from 9:30am-12:00pm, primary caregivers of children ages 1-5 can drop their children off in the parish nursery for childcare while the caregiver gets a couple of hours of free time to run errands, relax, clean house, whatever without a little one under foot. There is a fee of \$15 per child per day, and a registration form. Parents with more than two children pay a maximum of \$30 per day. There is currently a waiting list for this ministry. Sign up to get on the list today.

AFGHAN REFUGEE FAMILY UPDATE

There are highs and lows to report. First the happy news: Shamila is expecting their fourth child! Also, their oldest son was awarded a certificate for leadership at his school and has been asked to give tours to new Afghan students. The registrar shared that he told her, "My dad tells me always to help people and be of service."

A new challenge this family is facing is their car engine went bad and is cost prohibitive to fix. They were able to sell it for parts but need a good used car which seats six or more and ideally gets good gas mileage. Bilal is currently working for Door Dash until he finds more permanent employment.

On a very concerning note, Nabila, Shamila, their children, and sister have all applied for their green cards, and Farhad is due to start the process shortly. However, the Department of Homeland Security just reported that they are suspending green card processing for additional screening. It should be noted that thorough vetting has already been performed through their asylum process and this action raises concerns that their status may be at risk. We ask for your prayers and advocacy for protection of these families who would be at great risk should they not be permitted to stay.

We continue to work with the Archdiocese of Seattle to stay up to date on current immigration policies and how to support immigrants and refugees. 

The Liturgy in the First Century

Through the liturgy, we as the people of God approach God, and it is during the liturgy that, as the author of Hebrews tells us, we "come to Mount Zion and to the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem" (Hebrews 12:22). For two sessions, on Tuesday, April 22, and Tuesday, April 29 from 6:30-8:00pm we will study the liturgy in the First Century church as a way of deepening our appreciation and understanding of the liturgy and of the way in which the liturgy leads us to God.

The Eucharist

What does the Bible teach about the Eucharist? Is the Eucharist purely symbolic, as many believe, or is Christ truly present in the Eucharist, as the Catholic Church teaches? What is the basis of the Catholic belief in the Real Presence? What is the relationship between Jewish worship and the Eucharist? Join us as we explore these and other questions in a study of the Eucharist. The class will be held each week on Thursday evenings from 7:00-8:30pm starting on April 24.

Bible Study: 1 Timothy

In his first letter to Timothy, St. Paul provides guidance on moral behavior, proper comportment, and church structure. Each Tuesday from 6:30-8:00pm starting on May 13, we will study and discuss 1 Timothy. The class will explore key themes such as the role of sound doctrine, the importance of godly living, and the qualities of effective leadership in the Christian community.
