A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR FR. BRAD HAGELIN

My dear Kirkland Catholics and guests,

Happy Easter! Jesus is Risen and has given us new life in Himself. That is truly the best news ever!

When Jesus walked this Earth in his three years of public ministry; His impact and time to spend with people was necessarily limited. He had time to really form and "pour into" his twelve apostles and a handful of women who accompanied Him throughout His ministry. Probably only around 10,000 – 15,000 heard Jesus preach first hand.

By Rising from the Dead and Ascending into Heaven, however, Jesus is NOW infinitely available to any person who wants to know Him. It was strategically the strongest move God could have made to be maximally available to His people. Jesus is present in the Eucharist, but also whenever we call upon Him. God is closer to us than we are to ourselves, but for this to impact our lives we must cultivate the awareness.

Where do I begin if – upon reflection – I am not cultivating this awareness? The one simple idea I suggest is to download the Hallow App for your smartphone. It's the #1 Christian app, is Catholic, and has a lot of great Catholic audio and other content. I have heard many people tell me that downloading this app helped them get the habit of daily, fulfilling prayer. The paid version has a massive amount of content, but the unpaid version has a lot in itself as well. I encourage you to check it out if you're looking for a boost in your spiritual life.

I hope and pray that this Easter Season abounds with holy moments. My prayers are with you and your families in this holy season.

Egg hunt! After each Easter Sunday Mass children will be invited to find eggs and look for


the golden egg. The child who

Residents include homeless persons and families. The donations are greatly appreciated. Often, food supplies do run short. SOCIAL JUSTICE COMMISSION

The Social Justice Commission takes an active role in working for a more just world. Styrofoam Recycling and the Helping to Feed Our Friends Garden are fruits of their work. Since the beginning of this year Social Justice Commission members have been:

- Participating in advocacy meetings with the offices of Senators Cantwell and Murray, and engaging in phone calls and writing campaigns to congressional representatives, and demonstrations advocating for the rights of immigrants and the marginalized.
- Promoting Catholic Relief Services Rice Bowl -Commission members have received training to educate and encourage support of Catholic Relief Services in this significant time of need for global lifesaving.
- Working with the current Kirkland City Council Faith Convening on Homelessness.
- Training to be active in the Archdiocese Prison Ministry to provide a ministry of presence at correctional facilities and detention centers.
- Participating in the Seattle Archdiocesan Sponsored Laudato Si' Movement, WA, dedicated to mobilizing the Catholic community to care for our common home.
- Supporting the Tacoma Community House Annual Auction by donating a garden basket. This service center assists immigrants, refugees and South Sound residents in need of pathways to self-sufficiency.
- Planting and maintaining a Pollinator Garden at the southeast corner of the church, planting plants native to the PNW that provide food for pollinators like bees, butterflies and hummingbirds, which are critical for plant reproduction and food production (pictured).







'HELPING TO FEED OUR FRIENDS' GARDEN

The 2024 growing season yielded 336 pounds of produce, which was donated to Hopelink for distribution to those in need.
