# FR. BRAD HAGELIN

My dear Kirkland Catholics,

As you may have noticed, we are now almost in Lent. As you are probably aware the primary focus of Lent is **conversion**, and specifically focused on how the three tools of prayer, fasting and almsgiving aid in the process of conversion. Fasting and almsgiving are not ends in themselves, though almsgiving is meritorious. Prayer is an ends in itself, because our connection and intimacy with God by itself is why God created us. I want to touch briefly on options and ideas for all three of these this Lent that you might want to consider integrating into your Lenten resolution.

**Fasting** is the cutting back on things that are not sinful in themselves, but by cutting back we create space for focus on God. Fasting from food or particular foods is a primary way we do this. The very hunger we experience or “check” on consuming a particular food is an opportunity to “remember why” and turn our hearts to God. In some cases (if one is single for example and don’t have dependents you are cooking for) eliminates the need to cook and/or go shopping and eating, all of which actually take quite a bit of time that can be given to God instead. Fasting from, for example, social media or television also provides greater opportunity to focus on God. Two Lents in the past, for example, I eliminated television (ESPN) from my morning breakfast prep and Facebook in separate years, and I didn’t bring Facebook or morning TV back into my life after Lent, realizing my life was more peaceful and grounded in the new routines of not having those things.

**Almsgiving** is giving to those who are needy or to other good causes. In participating in God’s mercy it helps the heart of the giver by softening the heart, sharpening compassion, healing fear of scarcity by training one’s trust in God’s providence. Rice Bowls are a good reminder, and discerning and updating one’s tithes to one’s parish and other philanthropic gifting is something to consider during Lent.

**Prayer** is the heart of all these disciplines. I would encourage you to use the Hallow App, or adopt another new daily discipline that you suspect might be a new habit that you would like to incorporate in daily or weekly life after Lent ends. You might consider attending a daily Mass once a week as well.

Final encouragement: if this column is any inspiration for a Lenten resolution, I encourage you to write it down right away and pray about whether to consider incorporating it Ash Wednesday. As we walk this Lenten journey together be assured of my prayers as always.




# Prayers for Couples in Marriage Preparation

## HOW TO DISPOSE OF BLESSED PALMS


By following these guidelines, you can ensure that the disposal of blessed palms is done respectfully and in accordance with Catholic teachings.

- **Burning:** After burning, the ashes should be collected and buried in the ground. This is the traditional method of disposal because it honors the sacred nature of the palms and returns them to the earth in a dignified manner.
- **Burying:** You can bury the palms directly in the ground if burning is not feasible. This should be done in a respectful location, such as a garden or a place that will remain undisturbed.

### Why Not Throw Them Away?

Blessed palms are considered sacramentals, which means they have been set apart for sacred use and the object is meant to draw us closer to God, and should be treated with respect. Throwing them in the trash is inappropriate as it fails to honor their sanctified status. The Catholic Church emphasizes that **all blessed items** should be disposed of in a way that reflects their sacred purpose, as outlined in the Code of Canon Law.

## CHILDREN AND FAMILY LIFE

**PARISH NURSERY:** While we love having children at Mass with our community, if you need some focused time, our nursery is available for children 18 months through 4 years old. It is staffed Sundays during the 9:00am and 11:00am Masses. The nursery is located downstairs. Parents are welcome to stay with their children if it makes them more comfortable. Audio from Mass can be heard in the nursery.

**CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD (CLOW):** Children are invited to join us for dismissal during the Sunday 11:00am Mass. The children hear the Gospel and have an opportunity to break it open with discussion, activities, and other stories that relate to the Gospel. No registration required and parents are welcome to accompany their children if they'd like. Children's Liturgy of the Word runs all year.

**FIRST RECONCILIATION & EUCHARIST PREPARATION:** Registration is now closed for First Reconciliation and First Eucharist Preparation for the current school year. If you would like your child to receive the sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Eucharist for the 2026-2027 school year, your child should be enrolled in faith formation their first grade year or attend Children's Liturgy of the Word consistently this year and their second grade year. The Archdiocese requires two years of formation for Sacramental Preparation. If you have questions, email Laura, [Lstanger@sjvkirkland.org](mailto:Lstanger@sjvkirkland.org).

**MOM'S MORNING OUT:** Wednesday mornings from 9:30am-12:00pm, primary caregivers of children ages 1-5 can drop their children off in the parish nursery for childcare while the caregiver gets a couple hours of free time to run errands, relax, clean house, whatever without a little one under foot. There is a fee of \$15 per child per day, and a registration form. Parents with more than two children pay a maximum of \$30 per day. There is currently a waitlist for this ministry. Sign up to get on the list today.



**CATHOLIC KIDS' CATECHISM CLUB:** You can join our faith formation program began any time. Kids 3 years old through 5th grade are welcome. 3 year olds to kindergarteners come on Sunday mornings during the 9:00am Mass for faith formation, where they will learn about the Mass. Our older kids, grades 1-5, can attend Catechism Club on Sunday mornings from 9:55-10:55am or Monday evenings from 7:00-8:00pm for an active, faith-filled, and joy-filled learning experience. Kids are divided into clubhouses based on grade levels. Each clubhouse completes challenges based on the curriculum set by the Archdiocese for their grade. Please let Laura Stanger know if you are the answer to her prayer.** Anyone who volunteers to work with children or vulnerable adults must do a criminal background check and complete the Safe Environment Program to keep everyone safe - the volunteers, kids, and the church. We are so very grateful for all of those who are willing to take the steps needed to work with our children. The program is now done online. Log on to [virtus.org](http://virtus.org) to check your status if you are already a volunteer, there may be some updates you need to make. If you are a new volunteer, log on and create a password. 


