Pastor's Column

My dear Kirkland Catholics,

On May 25 Pope Leo published his first encyclical letter, Magnifica Humanitas. An encyclical letter is a major teaching document, and it coming out about a year after a papal election tracks recent Pope's timelines for a first encyclical.

These types of documents are not, however, frequent. Pope Francis and Pope Benedict averaged an encyclical once every three years, whereas Pope John Paul II averaged an encyclical every two years. A long prelude to say that when an encyclical comes out, it should be noted.

I do have to say that the topic of this encyclical is unique and is the first document I can think of that concerns a topic that many parishioners have asked me about, and about which I didn't have a lot of easy responses.

The topic of his first encyclical is essentially Artificial Intelligence (AI). It clocks in at 42,000 words which is about 80 pages in Microsoft word single-spaced.

In two weeks it is my intention that my pastor column will provide a short takeaway after taking time to digest this document, but with recent layoffs at many Seattle-area tech firms that have impacted some of our parishioners I think it's important to note that technology has done so much good, but that the effects of technology on the dignity of the human person and upon labor/work itself has been significant, and could become staggering.

The Holy Father has a prophetic role in terms of standing up the excesses and abuses of the age - especially within the church, as well as generating a vigilance around trends that can corrupt and must be watched closely. On first read through, that's what this document balances well.

If you would like to read the document for yourself, you will find it easily by searching for "Pope Leo XIV encyclical."

Let us pray for our brothers and sisters who are unemployed and underemployed, and safeguard our families through vigilance about the potential negative effects of technology.

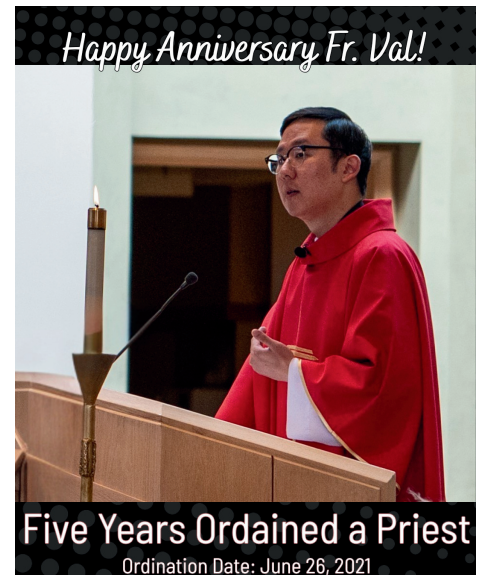
SUNDAY 5:00 PM MASS AT HOLY FAMILY PAUSING FOR SUMMER

Confirmation

On May 14, our parish family rejoiced as 59 youth and adults received the Sacrament of Confirmation, sealing them with the gift of the Holy Spirit and strengthening them for a life of discipleship. Archbishop Paul D. Etienne presided at the beautiful liturgy, joining our community in prayer as these candidates completed their initiation into the Church.

As we celebrate this milestone, let us continue to pray for our newly confirmed — that the gifts of the Holy Spirit may guide, strengthen, and inspire them to live their faith with courage, joy, and love.

For the past couple of years, I have been working my way back to the Church, and getting confirmed was the culmination of all those efforts to cooperate with the grace of God. Confirmation preparation was short but tremendously informative, and Father Val did a great job preparing my mind and soul to receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit. We also walked through the meaning of the different parts of the Nicene Creed at a deeper level than I had ever known, even though I have been reciting it for many years. Going through this class and receiving the sacrament has really cemented God and the Church at the center of my life. I hope to continue to express these gifts received in confirmation through daily prayer and involvement in parish youth and young adult ministries. - Teddy

The most meaningful part of preparation for me was listening to Fr. Val's responses and guidance. It was thought-provoking, taught me a lot I didn't know, and showed me deeper understanding. It also made me proud to be Catholic, because being Catholic in public isn't easy. - Shannon

In the beginning it felt a little nerve-racking, but by the end the program became fun and really meaningful. Confirmation helped me feel closer to God and taught me more about the Catholic faith. Experiences like adoration and the Confirmation retreat helped deepen my relationship with God. Making new friends and learning how to grow in my faith has been really special, and Confirmation helped me do that. - Celine

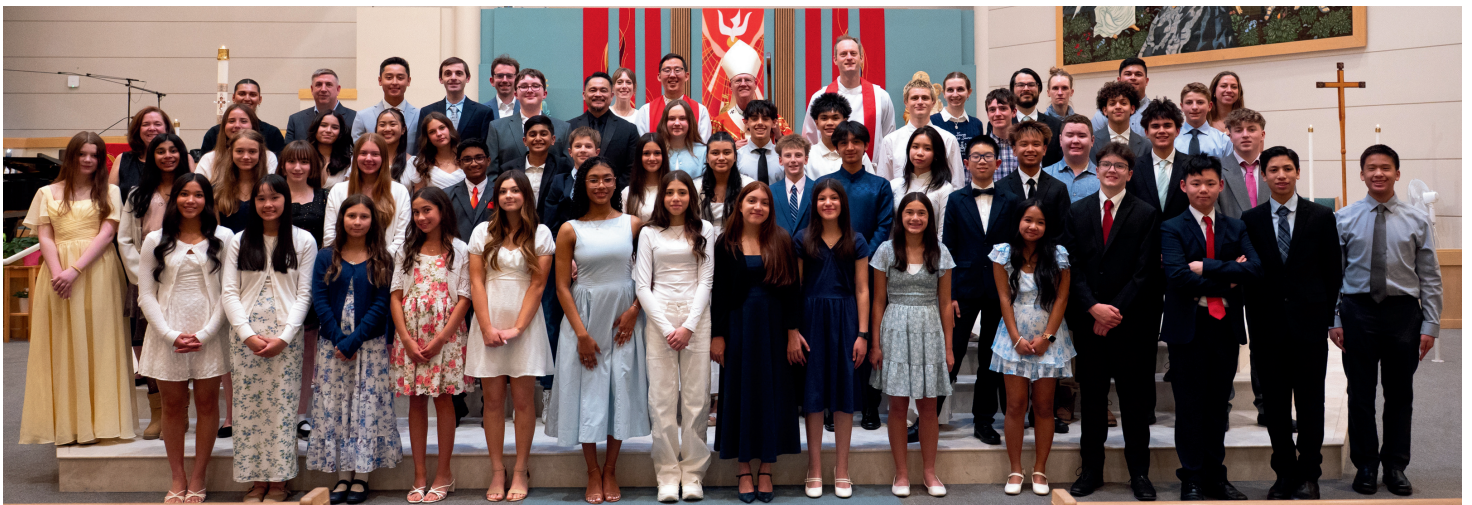
To keep growing in my faith, I want to keep going to church, keep praying, and get more into service and missionary stuff. - Max

The most meaningful part of my preparation was getting to talk about Christ with my sponsor, which was really special to me. What I enjoyed most about my confirmation program was getting closer with God. Since I started, I've been praying more and trying to be more thankful, and I've been noticing God in a lot of things around me. - Avary

I chose St. Faustina to be my Confirmation saint because it felt like she chose me. After reading a biography my Polish mom gave me, I began encountering St. Faustina everywhere — in something on Hallow, in a homily, and in our parish's "Jesus, I Trust in You" image. When I realized her feast day is also my birthday, it felt like a clear sign. I didn't have a sponsor at first, but two weeks before Confirmation my husband attended a young adults' dinner where Diana happened to present on St. Faustina, and he recognized it as another sign. She agreed to be my sponsor, and it felt like St. Faustina was guiding every step of my journey. - Ida

I hope to live out my faith as a confirmed adult by still going to church every Sunday. Lots of kids believe that once you get confirmed you don't have to go to Mass anymore, but getting confirmed should push you and encourage you to pray more, go to church more, and grow in your faith journey. Confirmation brings you closer to God and opens more opportunity to grow in your faith. - Maricel
